**✗ Skips are NOT allowed on roads with Red Routes or Double Yellow Lines or in Disabled Parking Bays.**

If you are not a part of the invoice scheme, Payment must accompany this application.

A permit is subject to renewal by application 5 or 7 clear working days (depending on type of road) before the expiry date. The maximum dimension of the skip permitted is 6 yards (5.5 metres). Anything bigger is classified as a Container. An application form is available from the address and telephone numbers at the top of this form. You should inspect the footway and/or carriageway before depositing a skip or materials and report any existing damage to this authority. Failure to do so will imply that the footway/carriageway was in good order and you could be charged for repair to any damage subsequently reported.

**LONDON BOROUGH OF LAMBETH      SKIP LICENCE CONDITIONS**

1. The licensee should ensure they have valid Public Liability insurance to the value of no less than £1,000,000.
2. Each skip deposited on the carriageway shall be so positioned with its longer sides parallel to the edge of the carriageway and as near to the edge of the carriageway as is reasonably practicable. It shall not impede the surface water drainage of the highway nor obstruct access to any manhole or the apparatus of any statutory undertaker or the London Borough of Lambeth's access to any other premises, unless the consent of the occupier of these premises has been obtained.
3. The skip shall only be placed on the footway or verge if the Council have expressed permission. The owner is liable to pay for any damage caused by placing the skip on the footway or verge.
4. The skip(s) shall not be placed within **18.3 metres** of road junctions, traffic lights, pedestrian crossings, entrances or exits from schools or hospitals (and such other premises as the Council may specify) or a bus stop, stand or terminus.
5. Each skip shall not exceed **6 cubic yards (5.5m)** unless specifically authorised.
6. Where more than one skip is on the highway at any one time, the skips shall be positioned as closely as possible to each other and the distance between the skips shall not exceed 2 metres.
7. Skips shall not be dragged or pushed along the highway.
8. Each skip or group of skips while on the highway shall be marked, guarded and lit in accordance with the following requirements:
  - (a) The ends of each skip (the sides of the skip facing traffic in both directions when the skip is positioned as mentioned in Condition 2 above) shall be painted yellow. There shall be attached as near as construction of skip allows, to the top outer corners of the ends of the skip, subject to an overriding maximum height of 1.5 metres above the ground for the top of the marking, vertical red and yellow fluorescent reflective markings which should comply with the vertical version of those prescribed for use as rear markings on heavy goods vehicles in Regulation 16, 17 and Schedule 18 of The Road Vehicles Lighting Regulations 1984 (SI 1984/812). The skip shall also be clearly and indelibly marked with the owners name and telephone number and/or address. The painting, markings and strips of reflective material shall at all times be kept clean.
  - (b) At night (between half-an-hour after sunset and half-an-hour before sunrise), an amber light shall be placed against or attached to each corner of the skip. Where two more skips are deposited in a row and the distance between adjacent skips does not exceed 1 metre, the amber light shall be placed at the end corners of the row of skips and intermediate lamps on each side at distances not exceeding 4 metres.
9. No skip, when standing on the highway shall contain any inflammable, explosive, noxious or dangerous material or any material likely to putrefy or which is, or is likely, to become a nuisance.
10. No skip shall be used in such a way that any of its contents fall on to the highway, or that there is an escape of dust from the contents of the skip when standing on the highway.
11. Each skip shall be removed for emptying as soon as practicable after it has been filled. The site is to be left in a clean and tidy condition.
12. No licence or licence extension will be made for a period in excess of 30 days. No skip shall remain on the highway after the period of this permission (and any extension granted under paragraph 12) has expired.
13. Consideration may be given to extend the period of consent, subject to application being made to the Council at least 5 or 7 clear working days (depending on type of road) before the current consent is due to expire.
14. Nothing in this consent or in these Conditions shall be deemed to affect or lessen the powers under Section 140 of the Highways Act 1980 of the London Borough of Lambeth or of the Police to require the removal or re-positioning of the skip from the highway.
15. The owner (as defined under Section 139(11) of the Highways Act 1980) will indemnify the Council against liability, loss, damage, claim or proceedings whatsoever arising under statute law or common law in respect of the placing and maintaining of the skip on the highway or its removal.
16. Skips are not allowed on double yellow lines or red routes. If you require a skip to be placed in a Parking Meter / Residents / Pay & Display Parking bay. Parking Shop on **020 7793 0192** must be contacted by applicants to suspend any restrictions (at a fee). Failure to comply will result in the Council taking legal action against the applicant under the Highways Act 1980.
17. A refund will not be given if a licence is cancelled due to no fault of the Council.

NOTE: Section 139(11) of the Highways Act 1980 contains the following definition:-

“Owner” in relation to a builder’s skip which is the subject of a hiring agreement, being an agreement for a hiring of not less than one month, or a hire purchase agreement, means the person in possession of the skip under that agreement.
