<p>Mid-late C19. Row of 7 cottages (almshouses) each 2 storeys, one window. Red brick with moderately low-pitched slated roofs, dividing walls with ridge stacks and central stone-coped shaped gable. Three-light casements in stone surrounds with alternating block jambs, those on ground floor with Tudor-arched heads to lights and segmental relieving arches over. Two 2-light windows flank central gabled porch. Other doors Tudor-arched and treated similarly to windows.</p> <p>Listing NGR: TQ3093077384</p>

DESCRIPTION

Calvary Church, formerly Methodist Church and Sunday School. 1900-1901, architects George and Reginald Baines. Perpendicular style in red brick with stone dressings and slate roof. Church has five bay nave, lower chancel, transepts, south west tower and splayed west porch. South west tower of three stages with crenelated battlements with gargoyles, traceried windows and wooden shutters to bell cote and horizontal bands. Lowest stage has lancet and arched entrance set in corner. West end has massive traceried window with trefoils and pinnacles. West porch is splayed at the corners and has two arched entrances flanked by buttresses. Cinquefoil-headed lights to nave divided by buttresses and transepts have two large traceried windows with roundel with quatrefoil above. Southeast gable with circular window and north east projection to chancel with a lancet window, crenelated parapet and pyramidal roof with finial. Attached to north west is former Sunday School in matching style and materials. Two storeys with gable on right hand side with traceried window and elaborate ogee-arched door case flanked by sidelights and projecting gable to left with triple trefoil window on first floor and four-light bay on ground floor. Church has ceiling of arch-braced type on stone corbels with ornamental square grilles, west gallery with trefoil design, elaborate carved wooden reredos with cinquefoil motifs, large fretted stone pulpit, curved wood and metal altar rails, original wooden pews and stained glass to windows and doors with unusual sunflower motifs. Former Sunday School has similar arch-braced roof: stained glass with tulip or lily design and scrolled metalwork balcony. Staircase has iron stick balusters and elaborate column newel. First floor room has original cast iron fireplace with four thin pilasters and panels of floral designs. [See BOE London 2: South p340. Survey of London Vol XXVI p41.]

<p>1882 dated on foundation stone. One-storey range in red brick with stone dressings and high-pitched tiled roofs. Projecting square bay windows, with hipped roof projections, alternate with paired entrances of round-arched doors well set back in porches with paired round-arched openings having impost blocks, moulded architraves and keystones; brick parapet over. Roof has tall ridge stacks and stone coped dividing walls with ball finials; a variety of ornamental terra-cotta finials decorate roof ridge and hip ends, some with wolves' masks. DESCRIPTION
<p>Circa 1870, the main house of a scheme designed by T Collcutt and built by Jennings, an enthusiast for the newly-fashionable terra-cotta as a building material. Two storeys, attic and basement, irregular fenestration. Three bays to Ferndale Road. One-bay left return to Bedford Road gives impression of startling height. Red brick with exuberant terra-cotta dressings. High pitched tiled roof with fancy ridge tiles and fish scale tiling to cheeks of wide dormer gables, breaking eaves, one on each face. Pale terra-cotta dressings include random block quoins (!) eaves cornice, strings, and architraves to segment-headed windows and round-arched doorway. Style mixes classical and Jacobean motifs. An elliptical full height oriel bay above entrance had strap work and balustrade; similar ornament is applied to a 2-storey canted bay on the Bedford Road front and to the gable above it.</p> <p>Listing NGR: TQ3062775415</p>

Stock brick with terra-cotta dressings, including vermiculate quoins. Fairly low pitched hipped slate roof with moulded cornice and deep, leafy brackets (overlapping second floor impost string) to segment headed windows. Impost string also to round-arched first floor windows with rusticated architraves on pilasters with guilloche moulded panels and capitals. <p>Symmetrical terrace composition of early-mid C19. Each house 2 windows wide; end houses have added entrance bay. Centre and end single houses project and are of 4 storeys; others of 3 only, all with basements. Stock brick. Stuccoed frieze and cornice, stone-coped brick parapet. Stuccoed basement and ground floor whose banded rustications form voussoirs to round-arched door and window recesses and elliptical door recesses in outer bays. Sash windows with glazing bars, round-headed with radial glazing on ground floor, under flat gauged brick arches above. Ornamental cast iron balconies on first floor. Tripartite windows in inner basements. Three-panel doors with panelled pilasters, cornice head and plain fanlight. Fairly low-pitched pyramidal slated roofs with eaves soffit. Banded rusticated stuccoed basements. Gauged brick arches to sash windows with glazing bars, flat except for ground floor which are round-headed in round-arched recesses. Eight steps to doors of 6 panels with patterned fanlights, set back in porch links with square columns and entablature. No 34 has GLC blue plaque: DAVID COX, 1785-1859, artist, lived here.
