STATEMENT OF COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT ADOPTION STATEMENT

Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004

The Town and Country Planning (Local Development) (England) Regulations 2004

In accordance with Regulation 24 (4) and Regulation 36 of the Town and Country Planning (Local Development) (England) Regulations 2004, notice is hereby given that the London Borough of Lambeth adopted its Statement of Community Involvement on 28th April 2008.

The Statement of Community Involvement (SCI) sets out the Council's approach to involving the community in the production of planning policy documents (the Local Development Framework) and in the determination of planning applications in the Borough.

An independent Inspector was appointed by the Government to examine the 'soundness' of the submitted SCI. The final Inspector's report, received on 12th March 2008, concluded that the SCI was sound, subject to a number of small changes. The Inspector's report is binding, meaning the Council must adopt the Inspector's recommendations in the final version of the SCI.

Lambeth Town Hall, Brixton Hill, London SW2 1RW and all public libraries in Lambeth, during normal opening hours (Brixton Central Library, Carnegie Library, Clapham Library, Durning Library, Minet Library, South Lambeth Library, Streatham Library, Waterloo Library, West Norwood Library and Upper Norwood Library).

Any person aggrieved by the SCI may make an application to the High Court under Section 113 of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004. Any challenge pursuant to Section 113 must be made on the grounds that the document is not within the appropriate power or a procedural requirement has not been complied with. Any application under Section 113 must be made no later than the end of six weeks after the date on which the SCI was adopted as stated above.

Any person aggrieved by the SCI may apply to the High Court for permission to apply for Judicial Review of the decision to adopt the statement. Any such application must be made promptly and no later than three months after the date on which the SCI was adopted as stated above.
