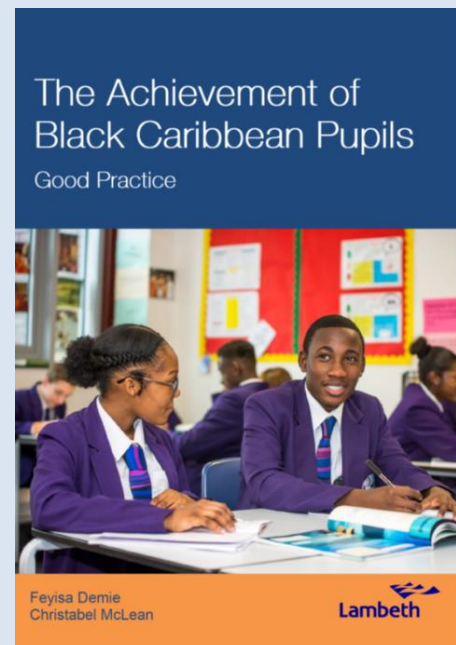


The Achievement of Black Caribbean Pupils in Schools

Join us for an evening of discussion on the achievement of Black Caribbean pupils as part of celebrating Black History Month.

Dr. Feyisa Demie will introduce new ground-breaking research by sharing evidence of how effective teaching and learning in the classroom, parental engagement, links with the Black community and the church and effective use of diverse multi-ethnic school workforce has helped Black Caribbean pupils in bucking the national trend. There will also be a discussion on the use of Black experiences to enrich the curriculum in art, dance, music, geography, history and technology.
