

### New green recycling bins – easy as 1,2,3

New green wheelie bins are arriving in Lambeth over the next few weeks.


When yours comes, look inside the lid for a guide to what you can recycle.

Please remember to rinse food packaging, bottles and tins and to fold paper and cardboard. Please NEVER put plastic bags, rubbish or food waste in your recycling bin, or it will be contaminated. They have their own bins.

Bins are greener for the environment, saving hundreds of thousands of pounds a year spent on throwaway plastic sacks. Bins are also safer from foxes and accidents, keeping your pavement cleaner.

## Central area office moves to Brixton

Lambeth Housing Management Central Area Neighbourhood Housing Team is finally going to start living up to the 'Central' part of the name – moving our customer services out of Greenleaf Close on the Tulse Hill Estate and into Olive Morris House (OMH) on Brixton Hill.

The new base should far more convenient for the majority of Central area residents in Brixton and Clapham with better transport links and easy access to other council services at Olive Morris House, Brixton Hill. Alongside the move, Area Housing team plans to try out new ways of working (based on feedback from customers), with Housing officers acting as focal points for all tenancy and housing management queries in their 'patch'.



# Clapham after dark

**Clapham leads something of a double life: during the day it is a busy neighbourhood high street and at night a thriving night-time economy.**

With the popularity of Clapham's bars and nightclubs, attracting visitors from outer London, Surrey and Kent, comes added pressures and challenges.

Often excessive drinking, noise pollution, littering and anti-social behaviour are evident late at night. But a lot of good work is done to protect both those people heading out to enjoy themselves, and those local residents who want to enjoy a quiet night in.

Targeted interventions within the night time economy, including the coordinated work of Street Pastors, St Johns Ambulance, the Metropolitan Police and local businesses through the This is Clapham Business Improvement District (BID), have significantly reduced levels of crime, anti-social behaviour and intoxication.

Cllr Mo Seedat, Lambeth Cabinet Member for Community Safety, said: "There is some really great work being done, not only to help Clapham's night time economy thrive, but also to tackle the challenges that success brings. We want people to come to Lambeth to have a good time, but to do that in a safe and responsible way. With all these different volunteers and organisations working together, Clapham is a great place to be – day and night."

Safer London Business Partnership and Clapham BID have recently won a silver award at the 2016 Problem Orientated Partnership (POP) Awards 2016. The award recognises best practice in crime prevention projects within the capital.

Jeremy Keates, This is Clapham BID Manager said: "The Clapham BID is really pleased that the Metropolitan Police Service has officially recognised the work that goes towards making Clapham a welcoming and safe environment at weekends."
