

Using Language and EAL Data to Raise Achievement

Seminar: Monday 4 December 2006

1. SEMINAR AIMS

The main purpose of the seminar is to examine:

- New DfES language census categories
- EAL assessment: Good practice and issues in Lambeth
- How EAL and language data is used in Lambeth to raise achievement.

Ample time will be allowed for participants to discuss the changes in DfES language categories and data collections. There will also be good opportunity for sharing good practice, interaction with speakers and discussion of the important issues involved.

2. BACKGROUND

The language census and EAL assessment data is an important source of information about schools. Since 1990 a remarkably detailed body of knowledge about the home and community languages used by pupils has developed in Lambeth schools. The Local Authority has also introduced to Lambeth schools proper statistical data-collection systems to monitor the language and levels of English fluency of the school population. The 2006 census was the sixteenth in the series carried out by the Authority since taking over responsibility for Education in April 1990 from ILEA.

The DfES is now embarking on detailed language data collections. The collection of first language and stages of English acquisition data can make a major contribution to the planning and implementation of strategies which promotes equality, values diversity and supports the education inclusion of all pupils. Good quality language and EAL data is of particular importance where provision for people who speak more than one language is involved. Linked to other contextual and census data, the likely benefit of good quality language and EAL data to schools, LAs and Central Government will include:

- Better information for schools about their pupils and the communities they serve;
- Better information at school, local and national level on the attainment of pupils and in particular of those learning English as an additional language;
- More effective allocation and targeting of language support resources, including bilingual support and interpreting and translation provision;
- Better identification of bilingual learners' language needs.
