

WHITE British pupils are being overtaken at school by students from ten other ethnic groups by the time they sit their GCSEs, an alarming new report reveals today.

At the age of five, white British students are among the top three highest achievers, and their shocking slip down the rankings by the time they reach 16 was last night blamed on the education

system and their parents. The trend will renew concern about the under-achievement of white working-class pupils, in particular, which MPs have previously labelled as 'staggeringly low'.

previously labelled as 'staggeringly low'. Researchers from the CentreForum think-tank said pupils without English as a first teachers beheed them catch up and their families were more supportive. Education experts said white British children were being 'et down' by schools and also by parents who did not fully support their

also by parents who did not fully support their education. In contrast, immigrant children were keen to make use of the educational opportunities' on offer and received huge support from their aspirational families. Professor Alan Smithers, director of the Centre for Education and Employment Research at Buckingham University, said

the results were 'concerning'. He added: 'On the face of it, the education

system is letting down white British children and we must examine the reasons with great urgency. The children of immigrants Turn to Page 4

Cholesterol drug without side effects of statins


SCIENTISTS last night hailed a new drug that can cut levels of bad cholesterol by half – without the side effects of statins. The breakthrough treatment, called Repatha, is in line to be the


first cholesterol-busting medicine since the 1980s. Since the 1980s. Trial results presented in the US yesterday revealed the drug had a 'significantly greater' impact than existing alternatives to statins. More than 7 million patients take

More than 7 million patients take statin pills, but up to a fifth have to stop because of muscle pain. Repatha has not been approved by NHS drugs rationing watchdog NICE, which had said it was not convinced the drug would reduce heart attacks and strokes. But officials have indicated they

may change their decision, with final guidance to be issued at the end of the month.


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
