









#### NATIONAL CURRICULUM TERMS AND DEFINITIONS

#### 1. The National Curriculum

Pupils aged 5 - 16 in state schools must be taught the National Curriculum. This is divided into four "key stages", which depend on children's ages.

#### **Levels of Achievement**

The National Curriculum sets standards of achievement in each subject for pupils aged 5-14. For most subjects, the levels range from 1-8. Pupils climb the levels as they get older and learn more.

Most 5 year olds are expected to achieve 78 points or more across all 13 scales, with 6+ in both the CLL and PSE scales.

Most 7 year olds are expected to achieve Level 2B

Most 11 year olds are expected to achieve Level 4

Most 14 year olds are expected to achieve Levels 5 or 6

Pupils must take national tests at the end of each key stage. These show a pupil's performance in selected parts of a subject on a particular day. At Key Stage 1 prior to 2005, pupils were tested in reading, writing and mathematics. In 2005 this changed so that teacher assessments in these subjects were reported, underpinned by the tests. At Key Stages 2 and 3, pupils are tested in English, mathematics and science. These tests give an independent measure of how pupils and schools are doing, compared with national standards in these subjects.

#### 2. Social Factors Influencing Performance

Research conducted over many years has shown that a pupil's background and circumstances can have an effect on performance. The tables and graphs on the following pages show the performance of pupils in Lambeth schools for each of the key stages. Some of the factors that Lambeth considers when looking at performance include:

#### Gender

Girls tend to do better than boys in all the key stages. This is especially noticeable in English.

#### **Free School Meals**

Previous research has shown a link between social deprivation and performance. Lambeth, in common with many other LAs, uses eligibility for free school meals as a proxy indicator for deprivation.

#### Fluency in English

Lambeth uses a London wide scale to describe the fluency levels of pupils whose first language is not English. "Stage 1" pupils are beginners, "Stage 2" pupils are becoming familiar with English, "Stage 3" pupils still need some support with English and "Stage 4" pupils are fully fluent in English. "Stage 5" refers to pupils who only speak English.

#### **Ethnicity**

Both National and Lambeth research has shown differences in educational achievement when ethnic background is examined. Lambeth collects ethnic background information using 21 categories, which best cover the diverse background of the borough.

#### **Note of Caution**

The tables on the following pages show the number of pupils in each category. Care should be taken when interpreting categories where the numbers are small, as the results can be distorted dramatically by the effects of very few pupils.









### KS1 Performance by Meals Status (Level 2B+)




KS1 Performance by Fluency in English (Level 2B+)









### **Key Stage 1 to 2 Contextual Value Added 2009**

#### Contextual Value Added (CVA) - Terms and definitions

CVA is not very different from VA. The basic principle of measuring progress from Key Stage 1 to Key Stage 2 remains the same. However, a number of other factors which are outside a school's control, such as gender, special educational needs, movement between schools, and family circumstances, are also known to affect pupils' performance. CVA takes these factors into account, which means comparisons against other schools becomes more meaningful.

Having taken into account the range of factors affecting performance, each pupil's CVA score is based on a comparison between their actual Key Stage 2 performance and their performance predicted by the CVA model.

**KS1-2 CVA Score** - An average of all pupils' CVA scores is produced for a school. That average is adjusted by the CVA model to account for cohort size, which then produces a school level CVA measure. This number is presented as a number based around 100 to indicate the value the school has added on average for its pupils. Scores above 100 represent schools where pupils on average made more progress than similar pupils nationally. While scores below 100 represent schools where pupils made less progress.

**Coverage Indicator -** This shows the percentage of pupils at the end of Key Stage 2 included in the CVA calculation. Pupils not included are new arrivals to the country with no prior attainment, or those previously educated in the independent sector. If the coverage is very low (below 50 per cent) then the CVA score is not published because it does not properly represent the effectiveness of the school.

**CVA Confidence Intervals -** The uncertainty of a CVA score as a measure of school effectiveness can be presented as a confidence interval (CI). This is a range of scores (defined by a lower and upper limit) within which we can be statistically confident that the 'true' school effectiveness will lie. The degree of significance that can be attached to a school's CVA measure depends, among other things, on the number of pupils included in the calculation with cohort size also having a bearing on the CI range.

#### **CVA** percentiles

The CVA percentiles give the distribution of CVA scores and show where schools are placed nationally compared to other schools, based on the CVA measure.





### Comparison of Lambeth and National Test Performance, 2009 (Level 4+)




#### KS2 Test Performance by Free School Meals (Level 4+)








#### Performance by Meals Status (Level 5+)





#### Terms used and their definitions

**Cohort -** This relates to the total number of pupils at the end of Key Stage 4, irrespective of their age. This figure includes pupils who did not attempt or pass any GCSEs or equivalent.

The KS2-GCSE (incl E&M) contextual value added measure - This is based on individual pupil progress between the KS2 tests and GCSE capped at a pupil's best eight GCSE or equivalent results, combined with other factors that are outside a school's control. For example, a CVA score will be adjusted taking into account factors such as gender, SEN, pupil mobility and ethnic background. For 2009 new emphasis has been given in this indicator for attainment in both English and maths.

**Confidence Intervals -** This refers to the range of scores (defined by an upper and lower limit) within which we can be statistically confident the CVA measure represents the overall effectiveness of a school. This relates to the size of the cohort i.e. the smaller the cohort, the larger the range will be and the less confidence can be placed on the CVA measure as an indicator of whether a school's effectiveness is significantly above or below average.

**The coverage indicator** - This shows the proportion of pupils at the end of KS4 (irrespective of their age) who were included in the value added calculation. It also gives some indication of schools where the value added measures may be unrepresentative. A low indicator means information was not available to calculate the value added for a large proportion of a school's pupils, and so these pupils could not be included in the calculation.

**Average Number of Qualifications** - This is the average number of GCSE and equivalent qualifications taken by students included in the Key Stage 2 to GCSE contextual value added calculation.

#### How to interpret a school's value added measure

Scores above 1000 represent schools where students made more progress, on average, than pupils nationally. Scores below 1000 represent schools where students made less progress.

For each of the KS4 CVA measures, a measure of 1006 means that on average each of the school's pupils achieved the equivalent of one GCSE grade higher in one subject than the average attained by similar pupils. A score of 1048 means that on average each pupil achieved one GCSE grade higher in each of their best eight subjects than the average attained by similar pupils. Conversely, a score of 994 means that the school's pupils achieved one grade lower in one subject on average, while a score of 952 means that pupils achieved on average one grade lower in each of their best eight subjects.





## GCSE Performance by Socio-Economic Indicators, 2009


#### **Performance by Meals Status**





#### Terms used and their definitions

**Cohort -** This relates to the total number of 16-18 year olds at the end of their A/AS or equivalent studies. CVA information is not shown where this figure is 10 or below.

**The KS4 to KS5 VA measure -** This is a new measure introduced in 2008 and allows comparisons to be made between institutions with different intakes by taking into account each student's starting point or Key Stage 4 prior attainment, usually attained whilst in Year 11 - the biggest single predictor of their results at 'Key Stage 5'. It also takes into account a number of other explanatory factors which have been observed to impact on its students' results, even after allowing for their prior attainment, such as gender, the type of qualification and size of the learning programme they have studied.

Confidence Intervals - This refers to the range of scores (defined by an upper and lower limit) within which we can be statistically confident the VA measure represents the overall effectiveness of an institution. This relates to a number of factors, such as cohort size. The larger the range between the upper and lower CIs the less confidence can be placed on the VA measure as an indicator of whether a school or college's effectiveness is significantly above or below the national average.

**The coverage indicator** - This shows the proportion of students at the end of KS5 study who were included in the value added calculation. It also gives some indication of schools where the value added measures may be unrepresentative. A low indicator means information was not available to calculate the value added for a large proportion of the institutions students, and so these students could not be included in the calculation.

#### How to interpret a contextual value added measure

Scores above 1000 represent schools where students made more progress, on average, than pupils nationally. Scores below 1000 represent schools where students made less progress.

An institutional VA score of 1030 means that on average each of the school/college students achieved the equivalent of one A level grade higher in one subject than the average attained by similar students. Conversely, a score of 970 means that the school/college students achieved one grade lower than the average attained by similar students.

Some examples for Key Stage 4 to 5 VA are: a score of 995.3 with a CI between 983.1 and 1007.5 means the progress made by students in the institution's 'Key Stage 5' cohort is not significantly different from the national average; a score of 1023.7 with a CI between 1015.3 and 1032.1 means the progress made by students in the institution's 'Key Stage 5' cohort is significantly above the national average; a score of 987.6 with a CI between 977.9 and 997.3 means the progress made by students in the institution's 'Key Stage 5' cohort is significantly below the national average.
