Green Homes Grant

£10,000 grant to keep you warm at home

Local Authority Delivery

Are you worried about rising energy costs?

Lambeth Council has joined together with 12 other London boroughs to carry out smart energy efficiency retrofits on thousands of homes. If you live in Lambeth, your property is EPC D, E, F or G, and you are on a low income, you may be eligible for the Green Homes Grant: Local Authority Delivery.


You may be eligible for up to £10,000 of grant funding to cover the installation of efficiency measures, such as insulation and smart heating controls.

How can I take part?

- **1 Registration:** Visit https://groundwork.secure.force.com/ghgenquiry and sign up, obligation-free.
- **2 Confirm eligibility:** You will receive a screening call from our team to confirm your eligibility by asking you a few questions about your income, benefits status, and household.
- **3 Property assessment:** A certified retrofit assessor will visit your property and create a whole house energy efficiency plan to make your home more energy efficient.
- **4 Agree to Works Plan:** You confirm which works are to be carried out and agree to a start date for installation to begin.

Can landlords participate?

Landlords can also receive £5,000 on behalf of eligible tenants and must provide 50% match-funding.

Work will focus on Clapham and Brixton where measures will include new lighting, CCTV and safety improvements to the public realm. These measures will also reduce other offences such as anti-social behaviour in these neighbourhoods.

The council has joined forces with police, local community organisations including Black Thrive, The Gaia Centre and the Lambeth Anti-Harassment Campaign to launch the Safe Spaces for Women and Girls group to improve safety in public places.

A campaign is also being developed to target VAWG perpetrators via social media. This will enable easier ways of reporting concerns and finding out what is being done to address them.

Our Climate Action Plan, released in March 2022, will set out how we plan to work together to create a fairer, greener, and more resilient future.

Climate Pledge

- 1 Recognise the global climate and ecological emergency
- 2 Put inclusive climate action at the centre of decision-making
- 3 Work towards reaching (net)zero by 2030 in line with limiting warming to 1.5°C
- 4 Immediately plan at least one climate action and begin implementation no later than 2022.

What is the Climate Action Plan?

A vision and set of goals for everyone in Lambeth, from residents' groups to our universities, to ensure we become net zero compatible* and climate resilient** by 2030.

How was it developed?

- **47** residents took part in Lambeth's Citizens' Assembly in May 2021, developing **13** recommendations, calling on the borough to take climate action fairly, effectively and quickly.
- **413** respondents submitted ideas to our online consultation.

We consulted with diverse voices across the borough including young people, older people, people with disabilities and faith groups.

Engagement workshop attendees included 13 organisations, 10
Housing Associations representing 63,000 homes, 7 Business
Improvement Districts (BIDs) as well as our emergency services, Brixton Prison, our major hospitals, 10 environmental groups and 6 voluntary organisations.

How can I get involved?

- 1 Residents can learn about the climate crisis and what they can do in our daily lives through the plan. Share your new knowledge with your neighbours too!
- 2 Businesses and organisations are encouraged to sign up to the plan's Climate Pledge and share commitments with their networks
- **3 Everyone** is invited to attend our Climate Action Plan launch event in March.
- *Net Zero compatible: Reducing emissions as close as possible to zero and compensating for remaining emissions through offsetting, such as planting trees.
- **Climate resilience: Where our communities and infrastructure are able to adapt to the changing climate.



Following the Local
Government Boundary
Commission's (LGBCE)
review of Lambeth's electoral
arrangements during 2020-21,
new wards will be in place for
the council elections in May.

The Commission carries out periodic reviews of local authorities' electoral arrangements to ensure they deliver electoral equality for voters, reflect community interests and identities and promote effective and convenient local government.

The Commission received more than 1,200 submissions from residents and local organisations

which helped decide the new arrangements:

- Lambeth will have 25 wards, an increase of four.
- The boundaries of all existing wards will change.
- Most ward names will change
- Lambeth will retain 63 councillors, the same as there are now.
- The 63 councillors will represent 13 three-councillor wards and 12 two-councillor wards.

Who are the Local Government Boundary Commission for England (LGBCE)?

The LGBCE is an independent body set up by Parliament to conduct electoral reviews of local authorities in England. They are not part of government, or any political party and are accountable to Parliament through a committee of MPs chaired by the Speaker of the House of Commons.

How to take part in Lambeth's elections

Elections to the new wards take place on Thursday 5 May when all 63 Council seats will be contested.

All Lambeth residents who are registered to vote in local government elections can take part, including European Union citizens.

If you live in Lambeth and are not already registered to vote, you must apply online at gov.uk/register-to-vote by Thursday 14 April to be able to vote on 5 May.

You can choose to vote by post instead of going to your polling

station. Your ballot paper will be sent to you by post, before polling day. If you want to vote by post at this election, you must apply by **5pm on Tuesday 19 April**.

Proxy voting is where someone else votes on your behalf, either at your polling station or by post. If you'd like to vote by proxy at this election, you must apply by **5pm on Tuesday 26 April**. Visit lambeth.gov.uk/vote for details on how to apply for a postal or proxy vote.

Poll cards will be sent to voters from 25 March. You do not need your poll card to vote but will need to confirm your name and address at the polling station. Find your polling station online at wheredoivote.co.uk

Lambeth sets out action plan following report into child sexual abuse

Lambeth Council has published its blueprint for implementing the recommendations of a national report into the abuse experienced by children in its former care.

The Action Plan sets out how the council will respond to the report "Children in the care of Lambeth Council", published by the Independent Inquiry into Child Sexual Abuse (IICSA) last July.

The IICSA investigation examined the scale and nature of sexual abuse experienced by children in the former care of Lambeth Council over several decades, spanning from the 1960s to the 1990s, and the extent of institutional failures to protect children in care from sexual abuse and exploitation.

The inquiry report recommended that, within six months, Lambeth should produce "a comprehensive action plan which details the actions that it will take in response to the issues raised throughout the Inquiry's investigation report".

Lambeth has co-operated fully and

transparently with IICSA throughout the inquiry process, to understand what happened to the children in its care, to examine the institutional failings, and to learn from the findings to ensure these failings are never allowed to happen again.

The council has apologised for the neglect and abuse experienced by children in its care, and established a redress scheme that has paid more than £70 million in compensation to victims and survivors of abuse at the borough's former children's homes.

Before IICSA's report was published, Lambeth had taken a number of actions, including addressing vetting and mandatory training for councillors, on corporate parenting and safeguarding.

The council's Action Plan is based around eight themes, each setting

apologises to all victims and survivors of abuse and neglect formerly in Lambeth's care. Lambeth was responsible for their care and protection but failed, with profound consequences, and we are committed to righting the wrongs of the past, as far as we are able.

But we know we have much more to do, and this comprehensive action plan is the latest step in our improvement journey. ••

The council's operational directors have been given responsibility for delivering on the 62 actions within the plan. Their progress will be regularly monitored, including through regular reports to councillors and the council's Chief Executive.


During 2021, Lambeth Council funded over 72,000 free places in 80 holiday clubs situated across the borough which ran during the Spring, Summer and Winter school holidays. These clubs served in excess of 144,000 meals via meals

provided as part of the holiday club session and Take and Make boxes, which are meal kits that children are given to prepare at home.

As well as a healthy, tasty meals, children and young people attending were also able to take part in an array of fun activities, including football, basketball, multisports, film making, dance, martial arts, cookery and creative sessions to name but a few! Some funded holiday clubs also offered day trips and residential programmes.

Lambeth's Spring of Food and Fun 2022 is going to be a blast!! They'll be a real mix of clubs running across the borough offering a wide range of activities for 4-16-year olds. Programmes will run at different times of the day and across a range of settings including youth clubs and projects, adventure playgrounds, sports providers and TRA's. More information will be available in March. In the meantime, contact your local youth organisation to find out their plans and book a space!






GET BOOSTED NOW LAMBETH

IT ISN'T TOO LATE TO GET YOUR FIRST, SECOND OR BOOSTER VACCINE

Having your Covid-19 vaccination is still the most important thing you can do to protect yourself and your loved ones. It's never too late to come forward for your vaccination. You can still book an appointment or go to a walk-in site for your first, second or booster dose. There are 20+ sites across the borough, including local pharmacies. The evidence is clear: for any Covid-19 variant, not getting vaccinated puts you at greater risk of serious illness or death.

12-15: Most 12-15 year-olds will be offered their vaccine either in school or at local community clinics. They can also make an appointment at a vaccination centre through the national booking service, and can attend some walk-in clinics. Those with health conditions will be contacted by their GP or specialist.

16+: If you are aged 16 or over you can choose to get your vaccine at a walk-in clinic without an appointment, through your GP or by using the national booking service. You don't need parental consent.

BOOSTER VACCINE:

You can get a booster vaccine if your second dose was at least three months ago and you are:

- · Aged 16 years or over
- Aged 12-15 with underlying health conditions that put you at higher risk of severe COVID-19.

New age groups may become eligible.

THIRD PRIMARY DOSE:

If you're 12 or over and had a severely weakened immune system at the time of your 1st or 2nd dose, you will be offered a 3rd dose of the vaccine usually around 8 weeks after your 2nd dose.

You can get your 3rd primary dose at a hospital service, GP or participating pharmacy. A healthcare professional will advise if you're eligible and the best time for you to have it.

Community Shop, the UK's leading redistributor of surplus food and household products, is a network of eight social supermarket stores in some of the UK's most deprived communities. They recently received a Queen's Award for Enterprise. Lambeth's awardwinning Community Shop has reopened for 2022, aiming to help twice as many people at risk of food poverty.

Following a major refurbishment, many more Lambeth Community Shop members will be able to buy deeply discounted goods, mostly donated by major retailers and manufacturers, The shop has been completely redecorated, and kitted out with new equipment to allow it to offer members more variety when they shop. It can also host more community events with redesigned outdoor space and a revamped Community Hub. The Vale Street site has a bigger Community Kitchen with new chef mentors providing affordable freshly cooked meals.



Here for you. If you are struggling to pay your bills or to afford food, we can help.

Who can use this scheme

The Household Support Scheme is available to you if you are:

- Struggling to pay your bills or to afford food
- Impacted in any way by the Covid-19 crisis, including having a loss of work or change in economic situation, increased caring responsibilities or an increased pressure on your household related to self-isolation or 'lockdown'
- Being resettled into the community following a period in institutional or residential care, including former rough sleepers being resettled in the borough after being temporarily accommodated elsewhere due to Covid-19
- In need of support to prevent you entering institutional or residential care
- A family or individual under exceptional pressure
- Setting up home as part of a planned resettlement

How to apply

All applications for the Household Support Scheme are made online. If you need support with making an application your support worker can make it on your behalf.
