ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984 - SECTION 14

TEMPORARY RESTRICTIONS OF VEHICULAR AND PEDESTRIAN TRAFFIC LAMBETH ROAD AND SAIL STREET FOR RAILWAY BRIDGE MAINTENANCE WORKS

1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that, to enable repair works to be carried out safely to the railway bridge over Sail Street and Lambeth Road, the Council of the London Borough of Lambeth intend to make an Order the effect of which would be:-

- (a) to temporarily ban vehicles from entering:-
 - (i) the south-east to north-west arm of Sail Street;
 - (ii) that length of the south-eastern arm of Sail Street which lies between Lambeth Road and No. 172 Sail Street (approximately 50 metres);

(b) at certain times to temporarily ban pedestrians from using:-

- (i) that length of the south-eastern footway of Lambeth Road which lies between the north-eastern kerb-line of the south-east to north-west arm of Sail Street and the north-western kerb-line of the south-eastern arm of Sail Street (an alternative route for pedestrians would be available on the north-western footway of Lambeth Road); and at other times,
- (ii) that length of the north-western footway of Lambeth Road which lies between the south-eastern kerb-line of the south-eastern arm of Sail Street and No. 202 Lambeth Road (an alternative route for pedestrians would be available on the south-eastern footway of Lambeth Road).

2. Alternative routes for vehicles affected by the restrictions referred to in paragraph 1(a) above would be available via (i) Juxon Street, Lambeth Walk and Lambeth Road; and (ii) Lambeth Road, Pratt Walk and Juxon Street.

3. Whenever the bans referred to in paragraph 1 above apply the bus lanes which lie on the south-east and north-west side of Lambeth Road (under the railway bridge over Lambeth Road) would be suspended.

4. The above bans and suspensions would only apply at such times and to such extent as shall be indicated by traffic signs.

5. The Order would come into force on 24th December 2022 and would continue for a maximum duration of 3 months (to allow for contingencies) or until the works have been completed whichever is the sooner, in practice it is anticipated that the works would only take place for up to 3 days but if the works cannot be completed or carried out during this time, the Order would also have effect on subsequent days,
