EXTENSION OF LOADING BAY IN TANKERVILLE ROAD

[NOTE: This Notice is about the extension of the loading bay in Tankerville Road adjacent to No. 22 Greyhound Lane. The existing double yellow line waiting restrictions at this location will be removed.

- 1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of the London Borough of Lambeth, on 8th March 2023 made the Lambeth (Charged-For Parking Places) (Amendment No. 5) Order 2023 and the Lambeth (Free Parking Places, Loading Places and Waiting, Loading and Stopping Restrictions) (Amendment No. 5) Order 2023 under sections 6, 45, 46, 49 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984. The Orders will come into force on 14th March 2023.
- 2. The general effect of the Orders will be to extend the existing loading bay on the south-west side of Tankerville Road adjacent to No. 22 Greyhound Lane and remove the existing double yellow line "at any time" waiting restrictions at this location.
- 3. The Orders are necessary to provide additional loading facilities as part of the planning permission granted for the development located at Nos. 16 to 22 Greyhound Lane. The extension to the existing loading bay on Tankerville Road will reduce the number of deliveries to a particular store and consolidate deliveries across stores, allowing them to reduce the total number of vehicles on the road network.

If any person wishes to question the validity of the Orders or of any of their provisions on the grounds that they are not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under that Act has not been complied with, that person may, within 6 weeks from the date on which the Orders are made, apply for the purpose to the High Court.
