## **'LONDON BOROUGH OF LAMBETH**

## THE CUT - CONTINUATION OF THE CONVERSION OF SHARED-USE PARKING PLACES TO WAITING RESTRICTIONS AND THE RELOCATION OF A SOLO MOTORCYCLE PARKING PLACE

[NOTE: This Notice is about continuing indefinitely the removal of the lengths of shared use parking places and replacing them with "at any time" waiting restrictions and the relocation of a solo motorcycle parking place in The Cut, which have been in force by way of experimental traffic orders.]

- 1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of the London Borough of Lambeth ("the Council"), on 25 August 2023 made the Lambeth (Charged-For Parking Places) (Amendment No. 18) Order 2023 and the Lambeth (Free Parking Places, Loading Places and Waiting, Loading and Stopping Restrictions) (Amendment No. 18) Order 2023 under sections 6, 45, 46, 49 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984. The Orders will come into force on 25 August 2023.
- 2. The general effect of the Orders, will be to continue indefinitely in The Cut to remove lengths of Waterloo 'W' shared-use parking places in lay-bys:—
  - (1) on the north-west side (a) outside No. 90 The Cut (5.5 metres removed); (b) outside Nos. 108 and 110 The Cut (5.5 metres removed);
  - (2) on the south-east side: (a) outside Nos. 65 and 67 The Cut (6 metres removed); (b) opposite Nos. 98 and 100 The Cut (5 metres removed); (c) opposite Nos. 108 and 110 The Cut (5 metres removed)

and in those lengths provide a ban on waiting by vehicles 'at any time' instead;

- (3) replace a 5-metre length of the Waterloo 'W' shared-use parking place in the lay-by on the southeast side, opposite No. 106 The Cut and provide a motorcycle parking place; and
- (4) remove the motorcycle parking place on the south-east side, opposite Nos. 98 and 100 The Cut and in that length provide a ban on waiting by vehicles 'at any time'.
- 3. The Orders are intended to continue to provide space for the installation of parklets.

- 6. If any person wishes to question the validity of the Orders or of any of their provisions on the grounds that it or they are not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under that Act has not been complied with, that person may, within 6 weeks from the date on which the Orders are made, apply for the purpose to the High Court.
