PROPOSED BAN OF MOTOR VEHICLES ON STOCKWELL TERRACE WITH EXEMPTIONS FOR ACCESS, PEDAL CYCLES, EMERGENCY VEHICLES AND VEHICLES WITH A VALID DISPENSATION VIA THE USE OF CCTV ENFORCEMENT

[NOTE: This Notice is about banning motor vehicles except for access on Stockwell Terrace]

- 1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of the London Borough of Lambeth on 29 September 2023 made the Lambeth Prescribed Routes (Amendment No. 9) Order 2023 under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (as amended).
- 2. The general effect of the Order will be to ban motor vehicles with exemptions for access, pedal cycles, emergency vehicles, and vehicles with a valid dispensation via the use of CCTV enforcement in Stockwell Terrace from proceeding westward from the western kerb-line of Clapham Road (A3).
- 3. The ban is intended to restrict through motor traffic on Stockwell Terrace while still retaining access to the adjacent properties and improve the amenity of residents.

If any person wishes to question the validity of the Orders or of any of their provisions on the grounds that it or they are not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under that Act has not been complied with, that person may, within 6 weeks from the date on which the Orders are made, apply for the purpose to the High Court.
