



LAMBETH BOROUGH COUNCIL TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT ORDER

LBC 2023 No. 45

The Lambeth (Prescribed Routes) (No. 6) Traffic Order 2023

Made 25th August 2023

Coming into force 25th August 2023

The Council of the London Borough of Lambeth, after consulting the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, in exercise of the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, and of all other powers thereunto enabling, hereby make the following Order: -

Commencement and citation

1. This Order may be cited as the Lambeth (Prescribed Routes) (No. 6) Traffic Order 2023 and shall come into force on 25 August 2023.

Interpretation

2. In this Order:

“**the 1984 Act**” means the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (as amended);

“**the 2016 Regulations**” means the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016 (as amended);

“**cause**” includes permits;

“**pedal cycle**” has the same meaning as in the 2016 Regulations;

3. No person shall cause any vehicle, other than a pedal cycle, proceeding in that length of Larkhall Rise which lies north-east of the south-western boundary of No. 63 Larkhall Rise to enter that length of Larkhall Rise which lies south-west of that boundary.
4. No person shall cause any motor vehicle proceeding in the length of Larkhall Rise that lies south-west of the north-eastern kerb-line of Edgeley Road to enter the length of Larkhall Rise that lies north-east of that kerb-line.
5. No person shall cause or permit any vehicle the overall width of which together with the load (if any) carried thereon exceeds 2 metres (6 feet 6 inches) to enter that length of Larkhall Rise which lies between the north-eastern kerb-line of Edgeley Road and the south-western boundary of No. 63 Larkhall Rise.

6. Nothing in Article 4 of this Order shall apply in relation to any vehicle, the maximum gross weight of which does not exceed 3 tonnes, being used for ambulance, fire brigade or police purposes if the observance of that Article would be likely to hinder the use of that vehicle for the purpose for which it is being used on that occasion.
7. Nothing in Article 3, 4, or 5 of this Order shall apply:-
 - (a) to anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform or a civil enforcement officer (CEO); or
 - (b) in relation to any person who causes any vehicle to proceed in accordance with any restriction or requirement indicated by traffic signs placed pursuant to section 66 or 67 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.
8. The Highway Network Manager or some other person authorised by them may modify or suspend the operation of this Order or any provision of it, (save that no modification shall make an addition if it appears to them in the interests of the expeditious, convenient, and safe movement of traffic, or for preserving or improving the amenities of the area through which any road affected by this Order runs.

Variation and Revocation of existing Orders

9. Without prejudice to the validity of anything done or to any liability incurred in respect of any act or omission before the coming into force of this Order the Lambeth (Prescribed Routes) (No. 2) Traffic Order 2003(a) shall have effect as though Articles 3, 5 and 6 of that Order were omitted.
