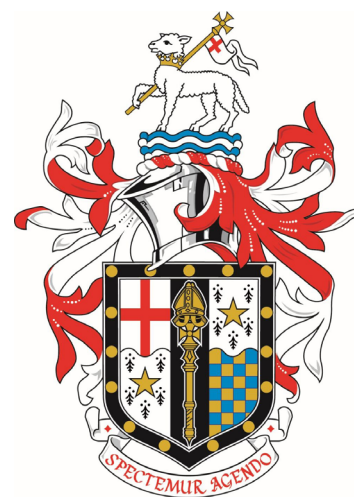
As part of the Awards Panel, it was heartwarming to read about our rising stars of the future, the impact of our community leaders, and the acts of heroism across Lambeth.

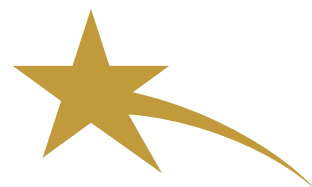

Deputy Lieutenant for Lambeth

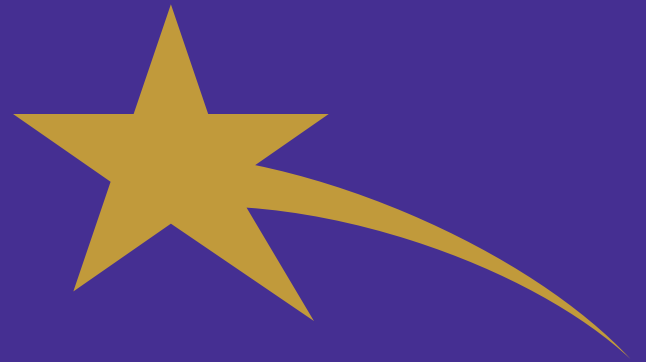

Hussein Hussein

Hussein, a first-generation Somali immigrant, faced challenges growing up in Lambeth. This helped him realise the value of participation in sport and youth activities. Hussein champions inclusion and community empowerment through Stretcham FC's football programmes.



Jochebed Frimpong

Jochebed, a BIGKID Programme Officer, supports the Flag Football program in Lambeth. Passionate about female participation in sport, she draws on personal experiences to empower others. Selected for Team GB Flag and Contact teams, Jochebed aspires to become a physiotherapist.



Omari Hunte

Omari is passionate about physical activity, leading socially distanced workouts for neighbours during lockdown. With BIGKID's support, he livestreamed these, reaching international audiences. He loves American Football and is a key player for the U19 South London Renegades.



Sammy Mckay

Sammy, raised in Brixton, witnessed first-hand how a lack of positive outlets impacts young people. As founder of "Champs Within," a free boxing programme, Sammy provides a focus for those from challenging backgrounds, inspiring them to write their own story through sport.



St Matthew's Project

Originating as a kick-about in Brockwell Park 20 years ago, this thriving youth project now engages over 300 young people weekly through football. Their mission is to help Lambeth's youth fulfil their potential and enhance their well-being through targeted support.



Commitment to Climate Justice Award

Celebrates those who are finding local solutions to the climate crisis, making the borough a more sustainable and climate resilient place for all.



Claire McDonald

Claire's passion for climate justice positively impacts her community. Through initiatives such as the weekly pedestrianised 'play street,' annual street parties, and the award-winning Guernsey Grove gardeners' groups, Claire consistently helps to organise collective local climate action.



Climate Ed

Founded in 2018, Climate Ed engages young people in climate change discussions and teaches carbon literacy. Working with primary schools in south London, their mission is to inspire children and families to take action to tackle climate change.



Herne Hill Forum

The Herne Hill Forum, community-led organisation, hosted a series of "Retrofit Revolution" events over the past year. These events included free talks from experts to educate and inspire locals towards embracing innovative technologies for a more carbon-neutral lifestyle.



Norwood Forum

Norwood Forum, a volunteer-led organisation, has demonstrated significant commitment to local sustainability initiatives. This includes hosting #COPNorwood26 and #COPNorwood27, facilitating community conversations about taking action on climate change and supporting local businesses.



The Streatham Common Co-operative (SCCOOP)

The SCCOOP, a community-driven social enterprise, oversees services from gardening to litter picking in the Streatham Rookery. Its efforts led to Streatham Common receiving Gold at the 2023 London in Bloom Awards and helped to create the new Willow Woodland.



Artistic & Cultural Achievement Award

Celebrates Lambeth's talent in the arts and cultural sector, those contributing to the local community, and people inspiring the next generation through this.



Henrique Sungo

Henrique, an Angolan-born Lambeth resident, co-founded Santano Productions with his friend, Filipe Anjos. This award-winning film and documentary company depicts themes such as daily life, war, and Covid-19. Henrique is also a respected author and actor.



Ne Kunda Nlaba

Ne Kunda Nlaba - screenwriter, actor, and political scientist - founded the London Pan African Film Festival (London PAFF) and Luanda International Pan African Film Festival (Luanda PAFF). His work celebrates Pan-African cinema, sharing films from Africa and its diaspora globally.



Ryan J. Matthews-Robinson

Ryan, founder and CEO of Poetic Unity, works to create safe spaces in Brixton, using creative mediums to empower young people. His personal experiences drove him to establish the charity in 2015, supporting young voices finding their expression and potential.



Pamela Price

Pamela manages The Beth Centre, supporting Lambeth's vulnerable women affected by the criminal justice system. Since 2021, Pamela has played a vital role in fostering a partnership with The Young Vic, resulting in free workshops and tickets for shows, including the recent play 'Tribe.'



The Boury Academy

The Boury Academy, a nonprofit Performing Arts School, Studios, and Acting Agency, provides affordable training for young people, promoting diversity in the arts. Their goal is to drive positive change, offer opportunities, and foster connections within the Lambeth community.



Outstanding Business Award

Recognises our fantastic local businesses and their outstanding contributions, going above and beyond to make Lambeth a great place to live, work and visit.



Black Culture Market

Black Culture Market celebrates black culture and commerce, increasing visibility for entrepreneurs of African and Caribbean descent. Their initiative promotes cultural products by curating exclusive Black Culture Market events in iconic London venues, boosting accessibility and success.



Kelly-Jade Nicholls

'Woke Babies' founder Kelly-Jade produces diverse, educational materials for children, emphasising positive representation. Creating an inclusive space through books, Kelly supports black authors to gain deserved recognition. Through her subscription service, Kelly also ensures accessibility for all.



The Platform Café

Since 2015, The Platform Café has become a community staple - a place where people can connect and celebrate good food. The focus areas of The Platform Café are promoting inclusivity, access to affordable nutritious food, and hosting community events and workshops.



VAULT Festival

Since 2012, VAULT Festival has evolved into a leading independent showcase for live performance and artistic talent. Providing an inclusive, accessible, sustainable, and affordable environment, it stands as an artistic movement for positive change, empowering creatives to showcase their talent.



Young Creators UK (YCUK)

YCUK is a creative agency that is owned by young people, for young people. By nurturing talent from Lambeth, YCUK is dedicated to serving underrepresented groups and providing young people with the tools needed to excel in the creative industry.

BIGKID Foundation

BIGKID Foundation, founded in 2008, seeks to eradicate youth violence and school exclusions through community engagement, mentoring, and leadership programmes. It annually impacts over 2,500 young lives by providing opportunities for growth and development.



Ecosystem Coldharbour

Ecosystem Coldharbour collaborates with communities and organisations to deliver violence reduction initiatives in Coldharbour Ward and surrounding areas. They host community outreach events, offer trauma support to families, and work preventatively to enhance community resilience.



Lorraine Jones

Lorraine is a much-respected figure in Lambeth. Building on the work started by her beloved son, Dwayne Simpson, Dwayndynamics has grown from boxing classes into a safe space for young people - steering them away from gang-violence, towards a brighter future.



Umer Khalid

As a Security Manager, Umer has gone above and beyond to keep communities across Lambeth safe. Demonstrating a strong commitment to the security of millions of daily visitors to Southbank - most notably helping to rescue a young woman from the Thames.



Wallee McDonnell

Originally from Ireland, Wallee is passionate about music and social justice. His passions led him to work for various London charities, and to his current role, heading up Celebrate Life CIC, dedicated to conveying messages of peace through films and workshops.

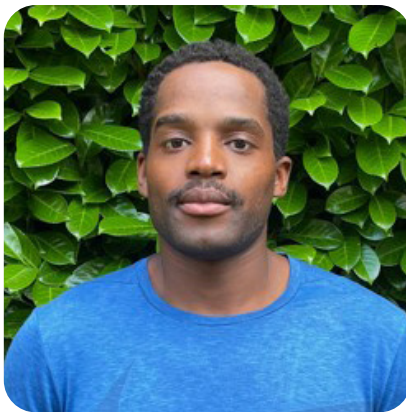
Natasha Pencil

Tinashé supports local young people. At Brixton Wings he works to address the lack of diversity in London's rowing community by running school holiday activities. He helps upCYCLE LDN with fundraising, project planning, and bicycle repair classes.

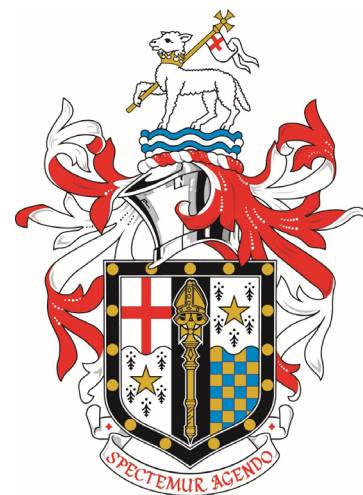

Clifton's longstanding commitment to Brixton Immortals Domino Club has helped build a well-established support network for members of the Black community. Clifton is committed to uplifting the community through events and by providing guidance and access to health resources.



Dr Chi-Chi Ekhaton

As an NHS England appraiser and GP Clinical Lead for the AT Beacon Project, Dr Ekhaton engages disadvantaged communities in London. She understands the disengagement felt towards health services and seeks to change the narrative, supporting vulnerable people to lead healthier lives.

For 40 years, Hazel has been dedicated to the local community. As treasurer for the Tulse Hill TRA, she has orchestrated a diverse array of community activities and her advocacy for inclusivity and expansion of services reflects her passion for community empowerment.

Brandon, founder of To Honour Youth CIC, works in Tulse Hill to deliver innovative gaming sessions to young people, creating a safe space to foster positive engagement. He supports organisations helping young people through mentoring, parent support and skills development.

Charmaine is an aspiring corporate lawyer and previous Jack Petchy award winner, currently working with Lambeth Youth Council. She led a particularly impactful programme of empowerment, confidence-building, and access to support for younger girls at her school.

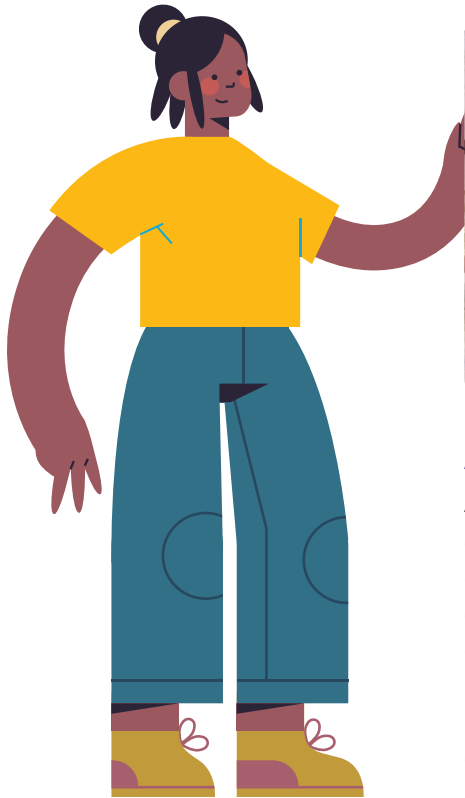
The JESSUP Committee Group

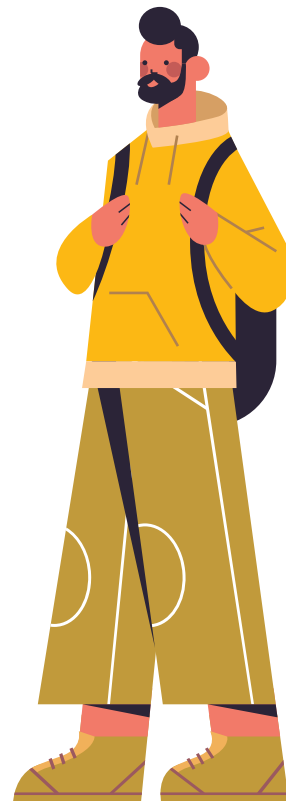
Mary Ekenachi

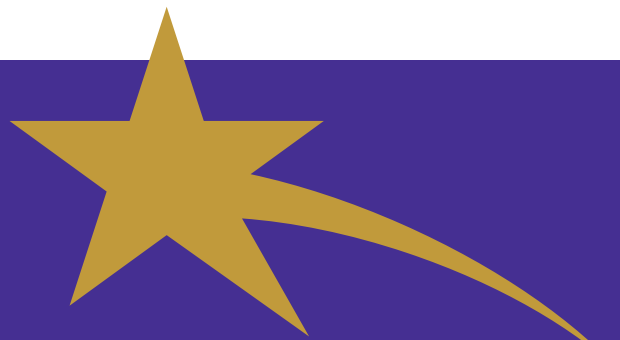
Olive Branch Aid

Autism Voice is a charity that advocates for children and families with Autism and other neurodevelopment disorders, mainly from Black and multi-ethnic communities. They organise programmes, offering SEN-related support to parents, and arrange events/trips for the children.



Ebinehita Iyere

Ebinehita is founder of Milk Honey Bees, a creative and expressive safe space for Black girls to flourish and put H.E.R (Healing, Empowerment and Resilience) first. Milk Honey Bees is rooted in the creativity, celebration and liberation of Black Girlhood.



Francklin Evagle

Francklin is an active member of his community. He founded KataKata, a vegan cafe and community hub in Brixton Hill. He also ran a food bank in the pandemic and supports young people with skills development opportunities and mentoring.



Itua Moses & Wyn Mowatt

Two long-serving, dedicated security officers from Lambeth. Their immense courage was demonstrated during a homophobic attack at one of Lambeth's most cherished LGBTQ+ venues, where they de-escalated the incident and prevented further tragedy.



The Friends of Windmill Gardens

Formed 20 years ago with the mission of rescuing the historic landmark, Brixton Windmill, from dereliction. Alongside successful restoration, the charity mobilises the community, offering a variety of events and services in their community centre.

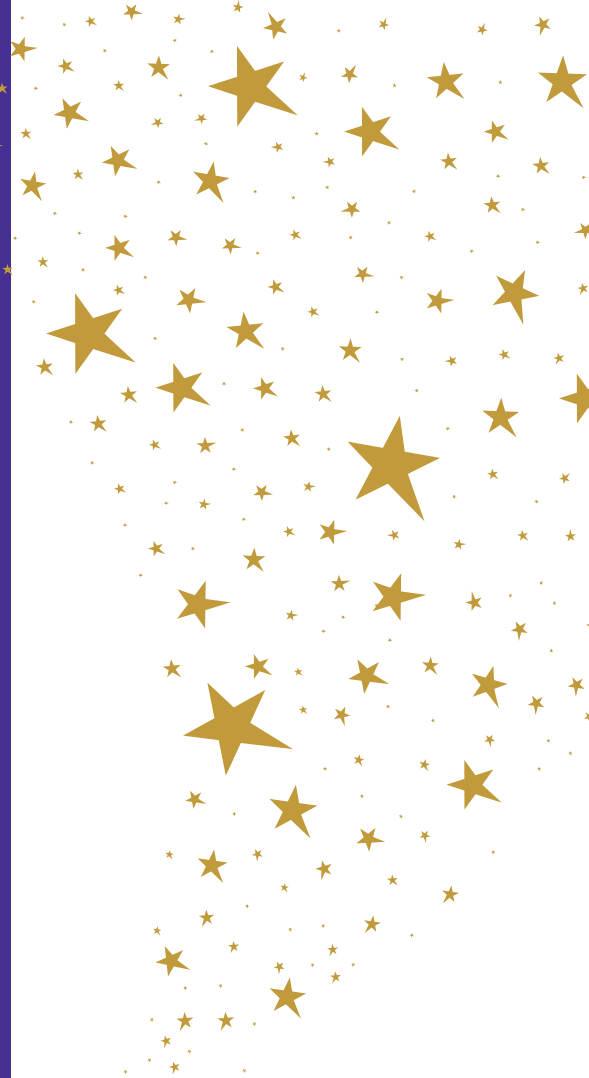
