

RESEARCH AND STATISTICS UNIT THE ACHIEVEMENT OF PORTUGUESE PUPILS IN LAMBETH

Research Brief - 2023

1. Introduction

This report presents the results of the 2023 Key Stage 1, 2, and GCSE tests and assessments for Portuguese pupils in Lambeth. The purpose of this report is to encourage the use of Key Stage data and to provide questions as a basis for improving Key Stage performance for Portuguese pupils in schools.

2. Overall Achievement and Main Findings

Table 1 shows the results in 2023 for tests at KS1, KS2 and GCSE. In the primary phase Portuguese pupils generally performed below the Lambeth and national outcomes in all subjects, although they were above the national in maths at KS2. At GCSE their outcomes were more favourable, being on a par with the Lambeth and national in the attainment indicators, together with a good positive score in Progress 8.

3. Contextual Factors Influencing Achievement

A pupil's social and economic background can affect educational achievement. The following sections discuss factors affecting Key Stage results. All calculations for the "gap" between different factors are subject to rounding. Overall, Portuguese pupils are a highly disadvantaged group with 41% eligible for free school meals at KS2, and 39% of the GCSE cohort. 56% are not fluent in English at KS1, although this drops to 28% at KS2 and only 9% at GCSE.

EAL data was not available for 39% of the GCSE cohort this year.

3.1 Gender

This year Portuguese boys achieved much higher outcomes than girls at KS1, which is contrary to the trend seen both locally and nationally. At KS2 and GCSE Portuguese girls outperformed boys in most instances, a pattern reflected nationally and across Lambeth. The largest gaps were in reading and maths at KS2, with Portuguese girls performing strongly in these subjects.

3.2 Free School Meals

Portuguese pupils who were eligible for free school meals performed below their paid meal peers at KS1 and GCSE, although the gaps were much smaller at KS1 between the two cohorts when compared to the Lambeth and national gaps. The reverse was generally the case at KS2 this year, with Portuguese FSM pupils eleven percentage points above the paid meals cohort in the RWM indicator, with their result also above the corresponding Lambeth FSM cohort's outcome. Portuguese FSM pupils were on a par with their Lambeth FSM peers in the GCSE 9-4 E&M indicator and nine percentage points above the national FSM result.

3.3 Ethnic background

Table 5 shows that Portuguese pupils remain, in general terms, a lower performing group when compared to the other main ethnic groups in Lambeth. Only Caribbean pupils were consistently below the Portuguese cohort. However, their GCSE results were encouraging and their positive Progress 8 measure was second only to the 'White Other' group.

Compared to other ethnic groups nationally, at KS1 Lambeth Portuguese pupils performed below all the major national ethnic groups (see table 6), but had relatively favourable outcomes at both KS2 and GCSE.

3.4 Fluency in English

Generally in Lambeth, the higher a pupil's level of English the better they perform, with fully fluent pupils often outperforming pupils who are monolingual English speakers. This is no different for Portuguese pupils who show the same increase in achievement alongside fluency levels at all key stages (see table 7 below). Bear in mind cohort sizes can be small in some cases, such as the English Only groups and the A-C non-fluent cohort at GCSE.

4. Conclusions and Key Issues

- In general terms, Portuguese pupils remain one of the lowest performing groups relative to the other main ethnic groups in Lambeth.
- The results of Portuguese pupils in 2023 were below the Lambeth and national averages in the primary phase, whereas the reverse was true at GCSE which is encouraging.
- Portuguese boys performed much better than girls at KS1 this year, with girls outperforming boys at KS2 and GCSE in all instances bar maths at KS2.
- In terms of free school meal status, the gaps in attainment were smaller amongst the Portuguese cohorts at KS1 than the outcomes seen both locally and nationally. At KS2 Portuguese FSM pupils actually performed better than their paid meal peers in three of the four indicators shown.
- Portuguese pupils show higher attainment the more fluent in English they become, which matches the general expectation for all EAL pupils.

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
