

Lambeth 2030: Strategic Partnership – Terms of Reference

Purpose Statement

Lambeth 2030 sets out a commitment to work in partnership, harnessing what makes Lambeth special. This commitment is reflected through the establishment of a new Lambeth Strategic Partnership (LSP) which will implement our ambitious vision for the Lambeth – a borough with social and climate justice at its heart.

The LSP will bring together our local anchor institutions, foundations and charities across a variety of sectors, creating a strategic, joint-working approach to delivering the outcomes laid out in Lambeth 2030 and build our collective voice for Lambeth’s communities and organisations. Together, we will equip the borough to be able to react to its most significant short-term challenges and opportunities, as well as plan longer-term mitigation strategies for future risks.

Functions of the Partnership

To deliver on this purpose, the LSP has three key priority areas. Within each of these is a set of functions that the partnership will be expected to deliver.

- 1. Delivering Lambeth 2030.** To oversee the implementation of Lambeth 2030 and to help focus our strategic work between a wide range of local partners.
The three main ambitions of the Lambeth 2030 - tied together with a golden thread of equity and justice - are:
 - Making Lambeth Neighbourhoods Fit for the Future
 - Making Lambeth One of the Safest Boroughs in London
 - Making Lambeth A Place We Can All Call Home
- 2. Cross-sector collaboration.** The partnership will be a space for information sharing and networking, to generate new possibilities and identify collective lobbying asks for Lambeth.
- 3. Responding to external factors.** The partnership will also have the flexibility to re-prioritise areas of focus, beyond those outlined in Lambeth 2030, dependent on emerging events.

Membership and Constitution

The composition of the LSP includes senior leaders from across wide a range of **key anchor institutions, foundations, businesses and charity sector partners** to enable networking, coordination, and responsiveness at a borough-wide strategic level. Its expansive membership places increased prominence on the breadth of Lambeth’s ambitions and their cruciality in delivering on the borough plan’s ambitions.

The LSP will have a co-chairing arrangement:

- Co-chair 1: Cllr Claire Holland, Leader of Lambeth Council
- Co-chair 2: **TBC**

LSP meetings will be serviced by Lambeth Council’s Policy, Equalities and Participation service. This will include the coordination of meeting dates and papers, which will be prepared in advance by presenting officers.

Membership of the LSP is outlined alphabetically in Appendix A. Each organisation is represented by a senior leader (i.e., a CEO, Chairperson or Director). Other organisations and representatives may be invited to join meetings on an ad hoc basis.

Lambeth Partnerships

The LSP is a non-statutory partnership and sits outside of any one policy area or thematic focus. It will not have any superseding statutory status or authority over Lambeth’s existing longstanding partnerships and boards, nor will it duplicate the work already being delivered by them. Existing partnerships and boards will retain ownership and responsibility for delivering on their respective strategies and policy commitments.

The LSP aims to add value, enhancing information sharing across the entire partnership network. It will help us to pool resources and leverage opportunities at a borough wide scale and contextualise the work of each purpose specific partnership in a wider strategic vision for Lambeth. Learnings and best practice will be shared between existing policy partnerships and the LSP.

Year 1 Work Programme

To deliver on the primary functions of the partnership, the proposed work programme for LSP will be divided in to 2 focuses: a ‘Partnership Events’ and ‘Strategic Workshops’.
