## **INTRODUCTION**

This is the 26th edition of the Lambeth "Education Statistics", providing statistical data on the Education Service within the borough.

Everyone now realises how important it is to measure performance by objective means. Statistical measurements can never tell us everything about the effectiveness of a service. However, they can help us to judge progress, to question our use of resources and to compare what we are doing with the achievement of others in our quest for constant improvement. Better statistics lead to better performance management. It is at the heart of what local authorities can do to support educational achievement.

In Lambeth, we are committed to making ourselves a questioning and a learning local authority. We hope this document will enable those in schools and other services to make better judgements about their own performance and to set targets for improvement. We intend that this data will also inform every aspect of our work and the decisions that the Council makes.

This data will help the service to manage performance better and to make best use of resources in addressing issues of pupil achievement.

The predicted population growth in Lambeth has slowed in recent years, however an increase is still expected of 28,000 people when comparing the 2021 ONS census statistics to the the projected 2041 GLA figure.

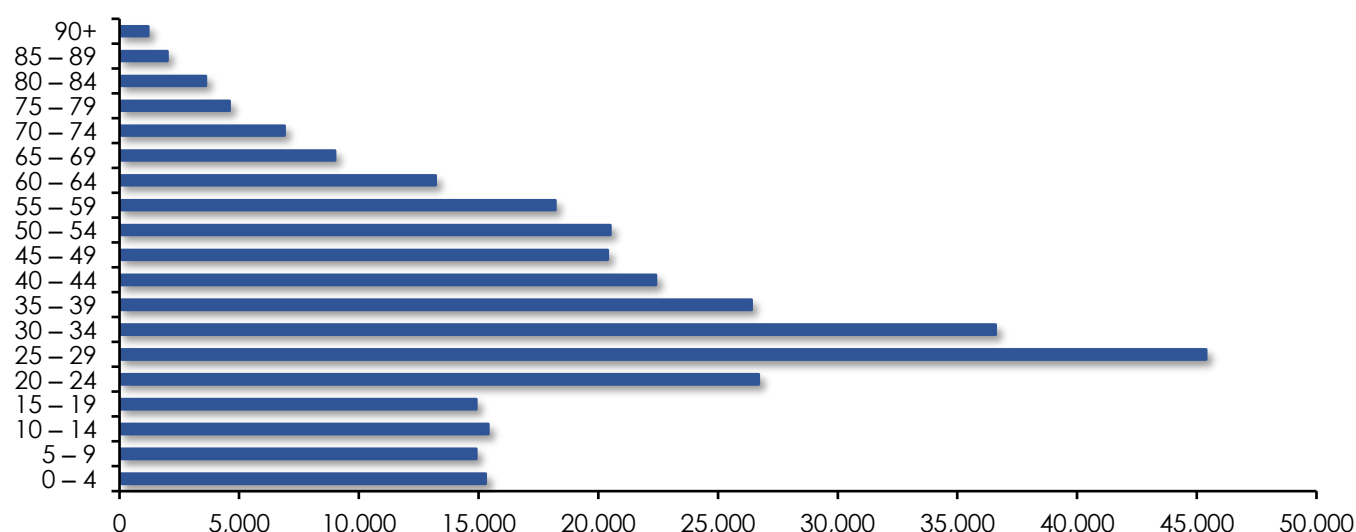
The GLA have various models they use to project population figures. For most purposes they recommend using housing-led projections, which reconcile future population growth with available housing supply.

### Lambeth Population (ONS Census 2021)



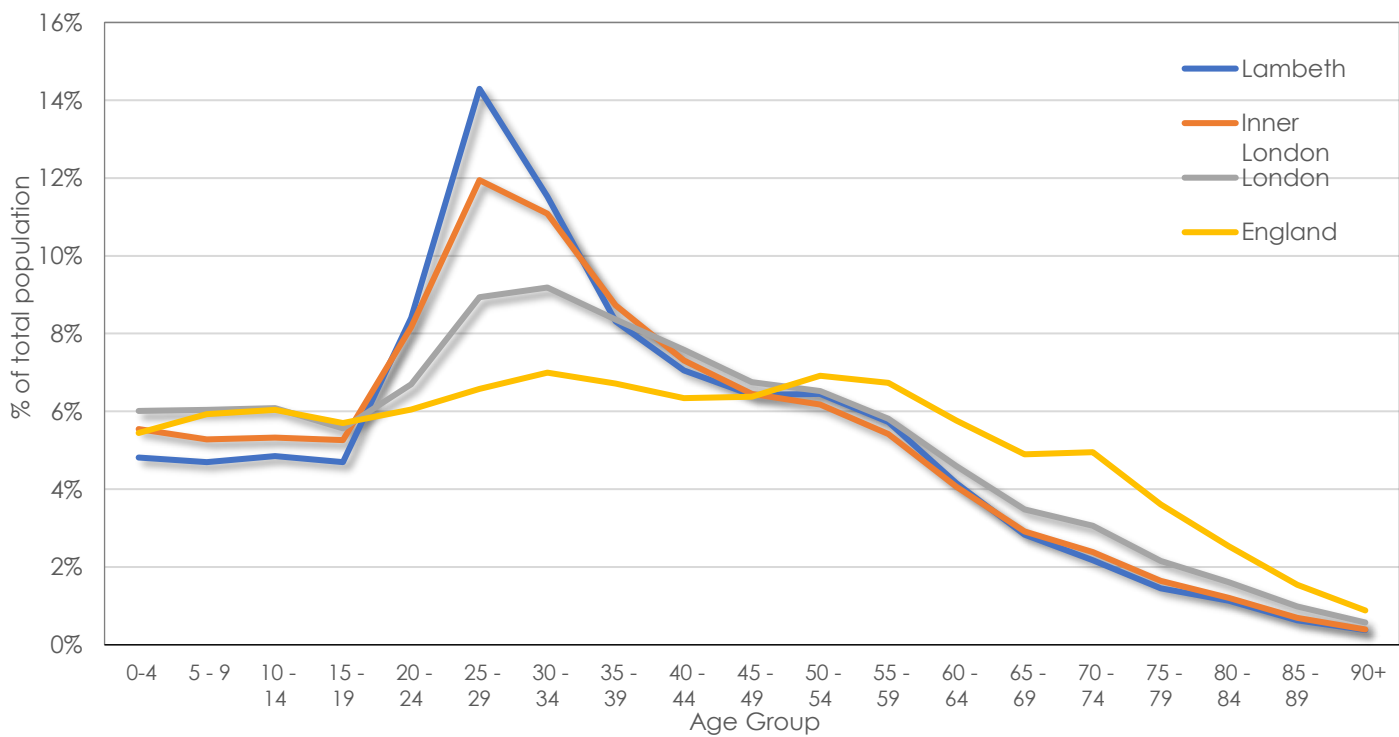

As the graph illustrates, Lambeth has a much higher proportion of people in the 25-34 age categories than the London and England equivalents. A quarter of the Lambeth population are in those age groups. The proportion of children under the age of 15 is below the London and national figures, with those in the 65 and over category forming a much lower proportion in Lambeth when compared to England overall.

Pupil projections, or forecasts, for Reception in Lambeth are an estimate of future demand for places, and include expected changes to population and considers historical trends in applications to school. Those who are resident in the borough apply for their school place via Lambeth Admissions and the Pan-London Co-ordinated Admissions system regardless of whether they want a school place in Lambeth or another borough, so the number of applications (or rather, applicants) is a good indication of demand for places.

The number of applicants each year from residents of each Town Centre area are used to determine the proportion of the resident population who make an application. The rate is typically 85% but varies within each town centre. This proportion is multiplied by our estimated population to calculate the projected number of applicants. This number is considered as the potential future demand.

Child yield, the number of children likely to be added to the population as a result of known developments, is added directly to these demand figures to show how new developments are likely to affect the demand for school

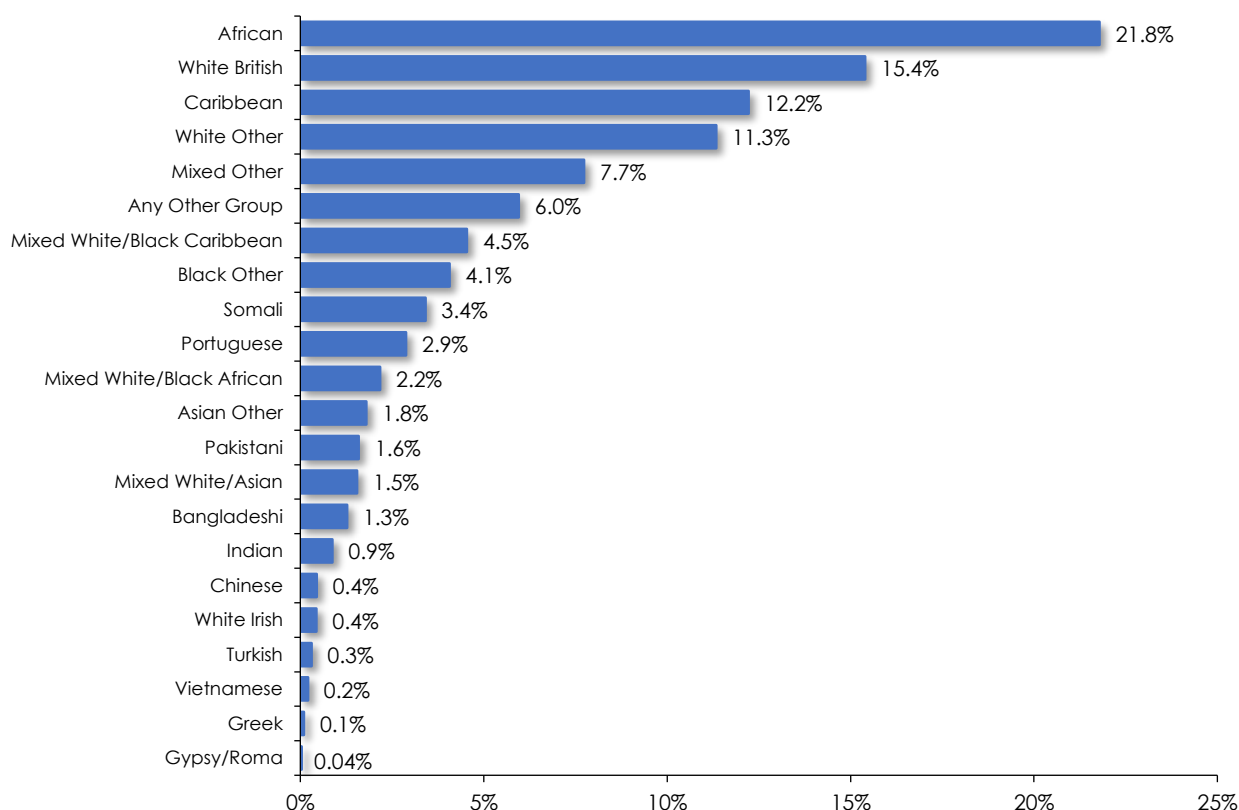

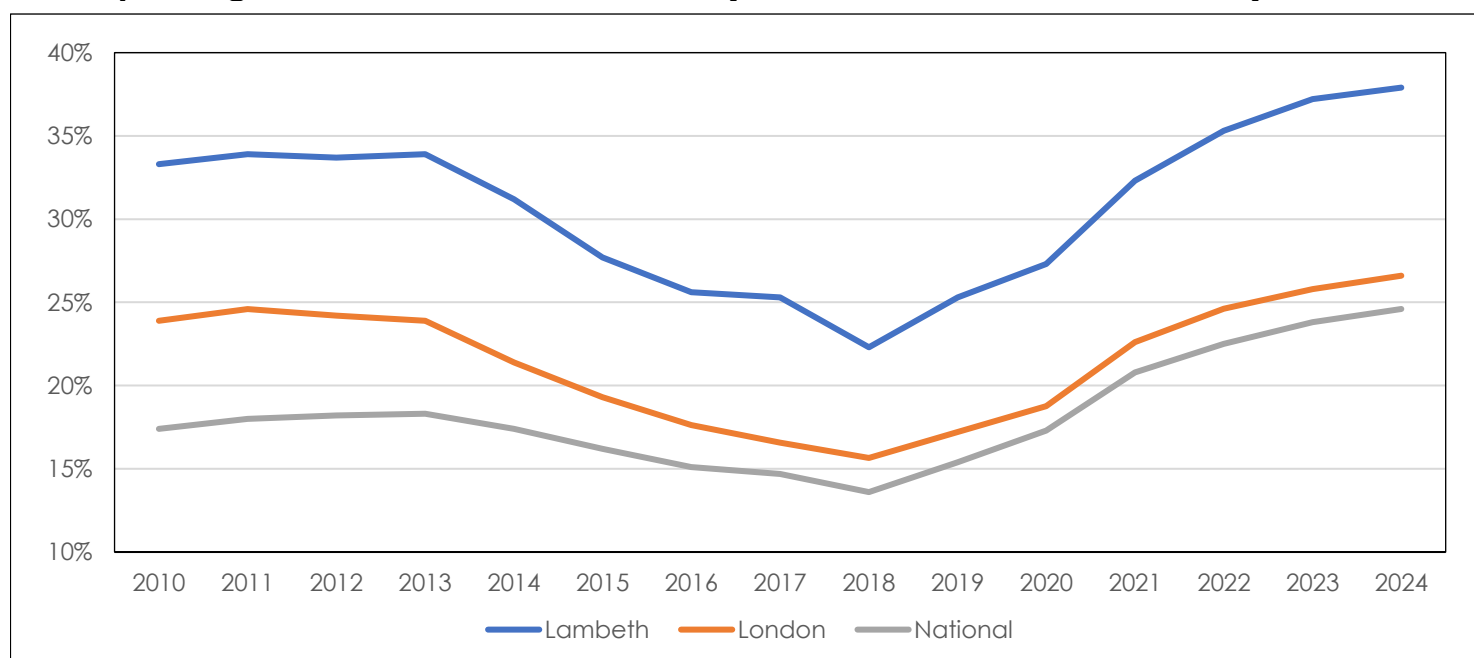

# NATIONAL CURRICULUM TERMS AND DEFINITIONS

## 1. The National Curriculum

Pupils aged 5 - 16 in state schools must be taught the National Curriculum. This is divided into four "key stages", which depend on children's ages.

### Levels of Achievement

In the Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) the DfE classifies a good level of development as those pupils at or exceeding all Prime Learning Goals and Literacy and Maths (12 Goals in total), with the other key indicator being those pupils at or above all 17 Learning Goals. The EYFS was totally changed in 2021 so in this edition comparison to previous years' data is not possible.

In the Year 1 Phonics screening check, the pass threshold (referred to as 'Working At' the level of the check) is 32, which means children had to read at least 32 words out of 40 correctly.

As of 2016, KS1 and KS2 results are no longer reported using levels and have been replaced by scaled scores. Scaled scores are based on the total number of marks a pupil receives in a test or teacher assessment i.e. their 'raw' score, and this score is then translated into a scaled score using a conversion table. A scaled score of 100 will always represent the 'expected standard'. Scaled scores enable comparison over time, as they represent the same level of attainment for a pupil each year. Therefore, a pupil who scores 103, for example, in 2016 will have demonstrated the same attainment as a pupil who scores 103 in 2017.

## 2. Social Factors Influencing Performance

Research conducted over many years has shown that a pupil's background and circumstances can have an effect on performance. The tables and graphs on the following pages show the performance of pupils in Lambeth schools for each of the key stages. Some of the factors that Lambeth considers when looking at performance include:

### Gender

Girls tend to do better than boys in all the key stages. This is especially noticeable in English.

### Free School Meals

Previous research has shown a link between social deprivation and performance. Lambeth, in common with many other LAs, uses eligibility for free school meals as a proxy indicator for deprivation.

### Fluency in English

Lambeth uses a national scale to describe the fluency levels of pupils whose first language is not English. Stage A are classified as 'New to English' and Stages A-C are classified as 'Not Fluent'. Those classified as Stage D are 'Competent', with Stage E pupils deemed 'Fully Fluent'.

### Ethnicity

Both National and Lambeth research has shown differences in educational achievement when ethnic background is examined. Lambeth collects ethnic background information using 21 categories, which best cover the diverse background of the borough.

### Note of Caution

The tables on the following pages show the number of pupils in each category. Care should be taken when interpreting categories where the numbers are small, as the results can be distorted dramatically by the effects of very few pupils.

### **COVID-19 and the impact upon performance data**

Following the COVID-19 pandemic, most exams, tests and assessments resumed in academic year 2021/22.

Pupils included in the 2021/22 KS2 and KS4 school performance data may have experienced varying levels of disruption to their schooling due to the pandemic.

We do not recommend making direct comparisons with data from previous years or between schools or colleges.

#### **Primary data (EYFS, Phonics, KS1 and KS2)**

No school-level primary test or assessment data was available for 2020 and 2021.

#### **Secondary data (KS4 and KS5 Post-16)**

At secondary level, only local authority and national data was published for 2020 and 2021. School-level GCSE and Post-16 performance data was either not available for 2020 and 2021, or has not been included here due to the fact no formal examinations were undertaken by students (see below).

2020 GCSE results were based on a teacher assessment grade or calculated grade, whichever is higher. 2021 data is based on teacher assessed grades only.

2020 post-16 (level 3) results were moderated teacher-assessed grades, with 2021 data being teacher-assessed only.

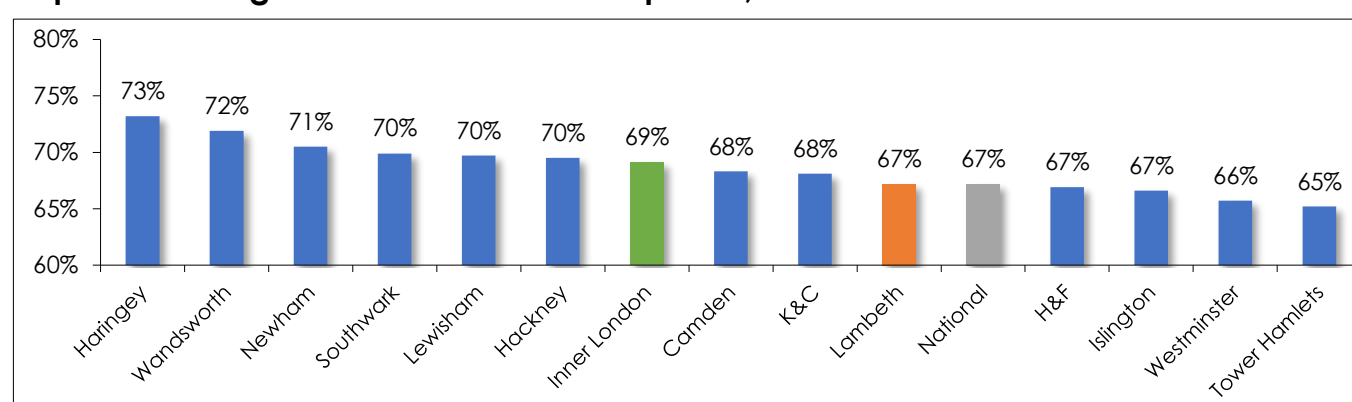

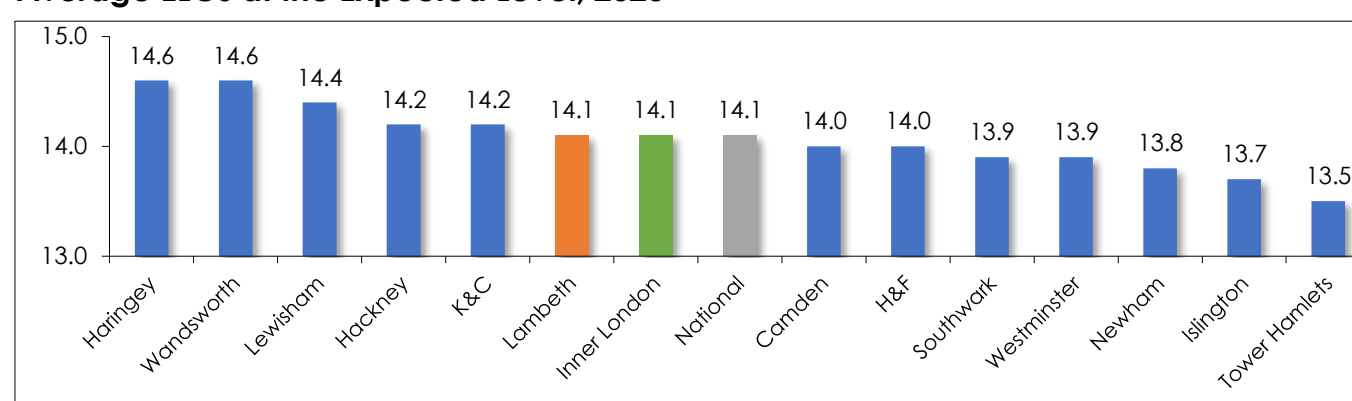

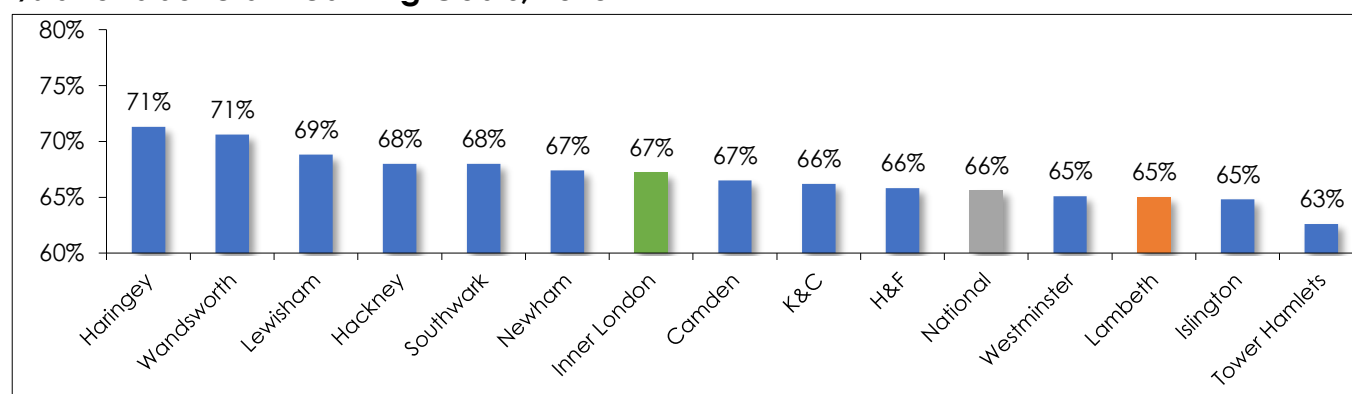
#### Pupils Achieving a Good Level of Development, 2023

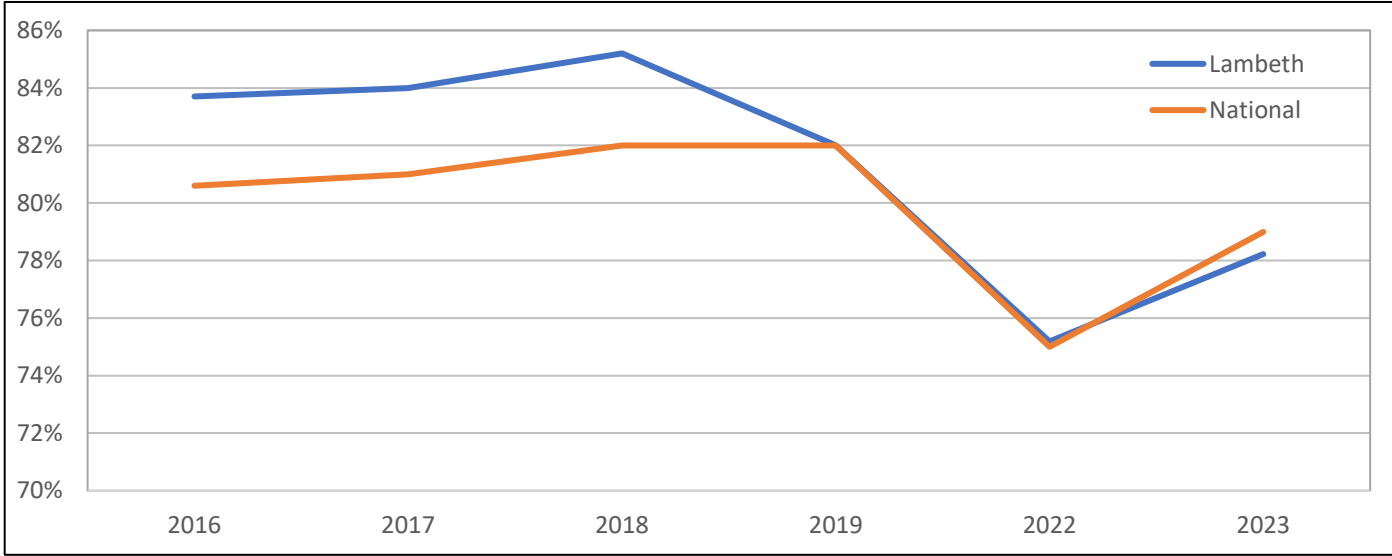

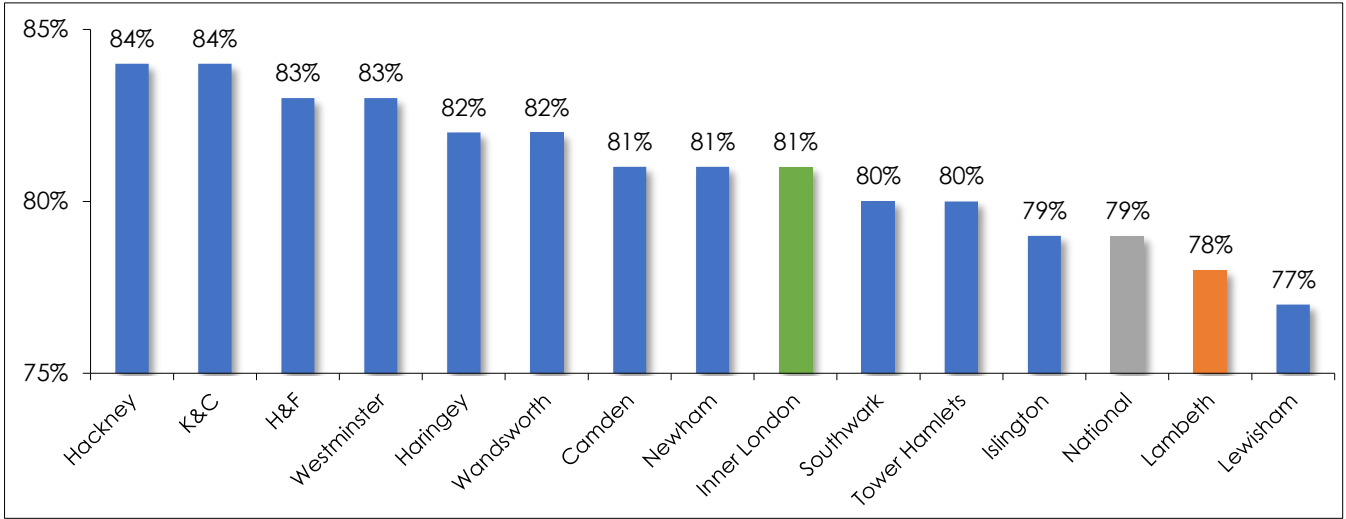

As of 2016, KS1 results are no longer reported using levels and have been replaced by scaled scores. Scaled scores are based on the total number of marks a pupil receives in a test or teacher assessment i.e. their 'raw' score, and this score is then translated into a scaled score using a conversion table. A scaled score of 100 will always represent the 'expected standard'.

Scaled scores enable results to be reported consistently from one year to the next, and therefore maintain their meaning over time so that two pupils achieving the same scaled score in different years will have demonstrated the same attainment.

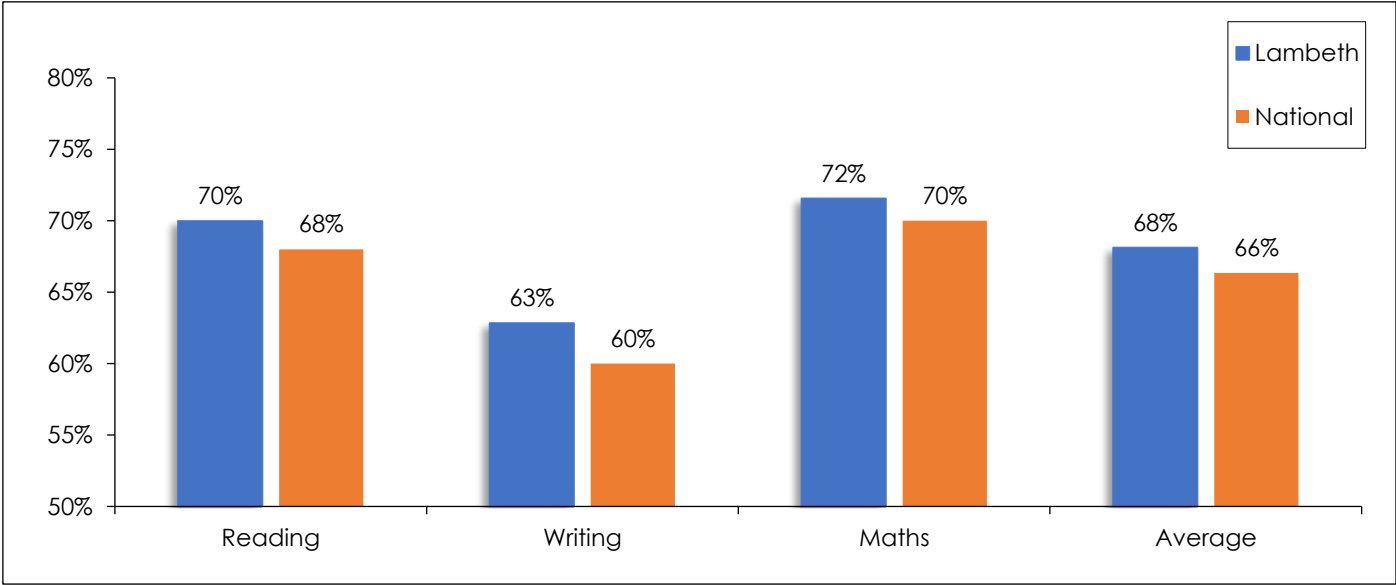

Scaled scores are based on the total number of marks a pupil receives in a test or teacher assessment i.e. their 'raw' score, and this score is then translated into a scaled score using a conversion table. A scaled score of 100 will always represent the 'expected standard'.

Scaled scores enable results to be reported consistently from one year to the next, and therefore maintain their meaning over time so that two pupils achieving the same scaled score in different years will have demonstrated the same attainment.

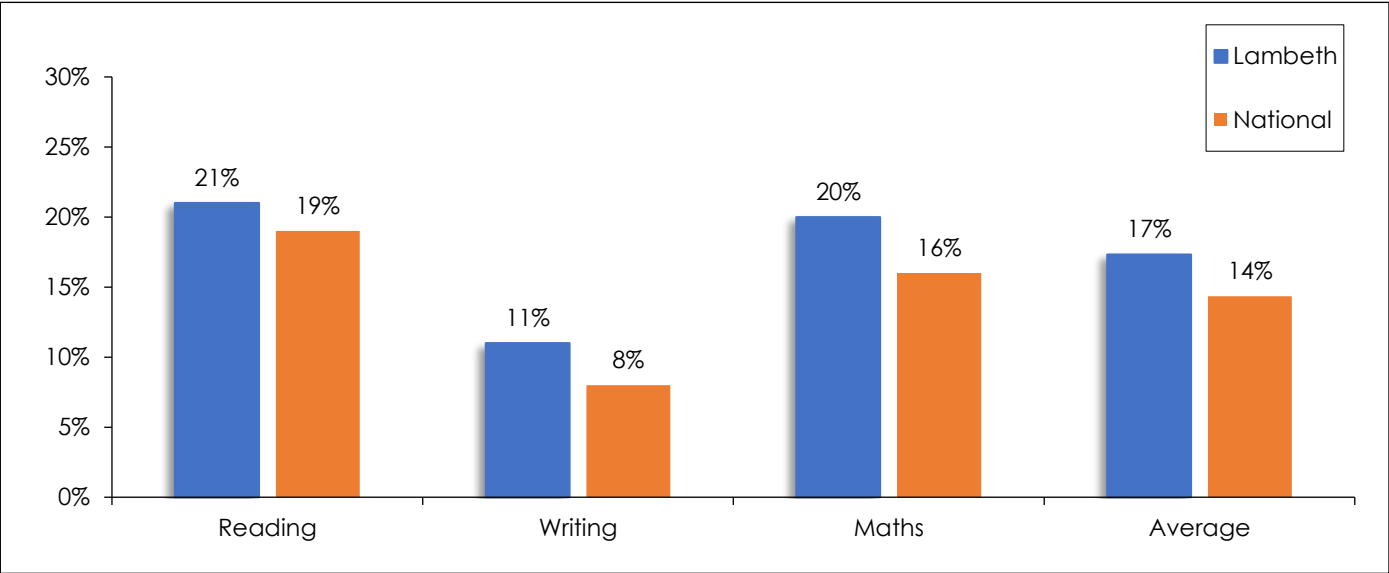

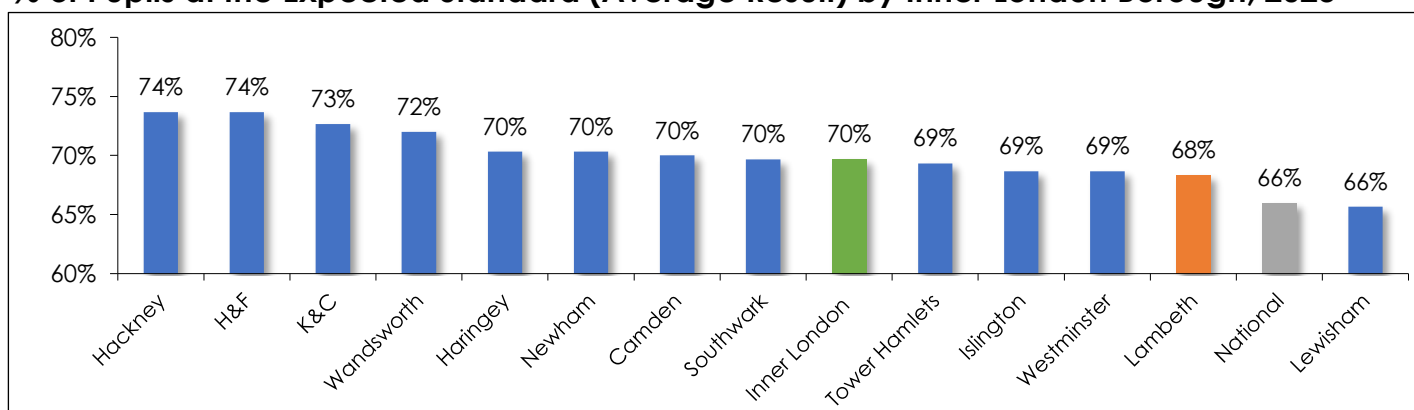

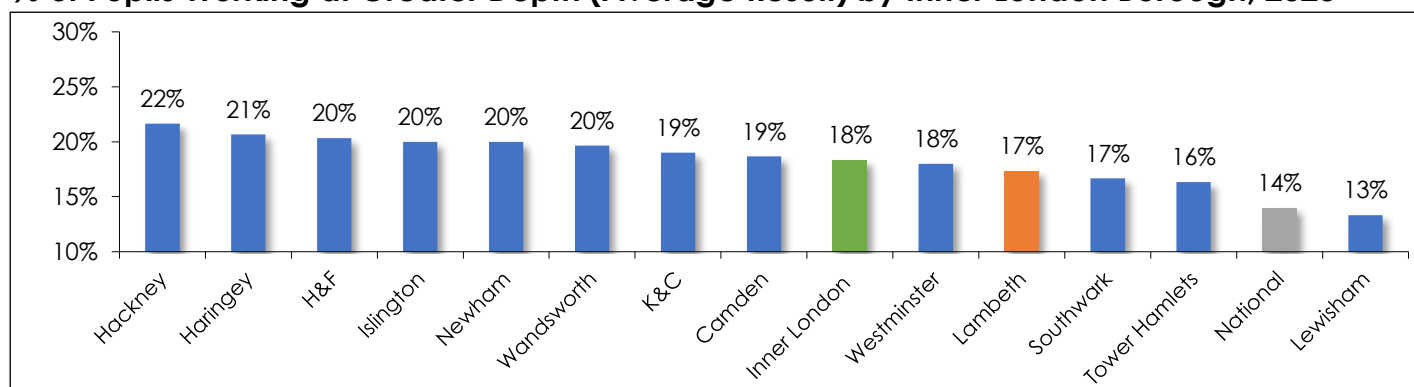

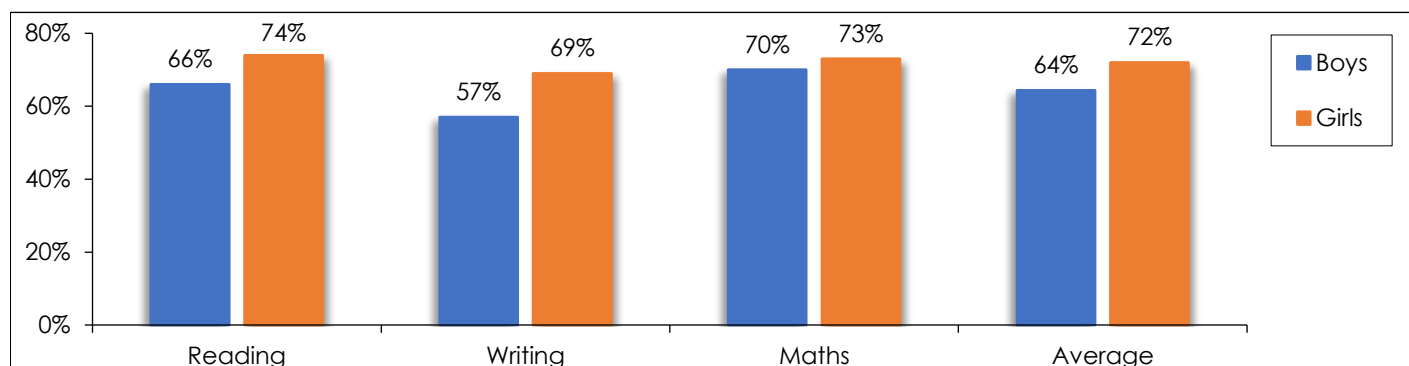

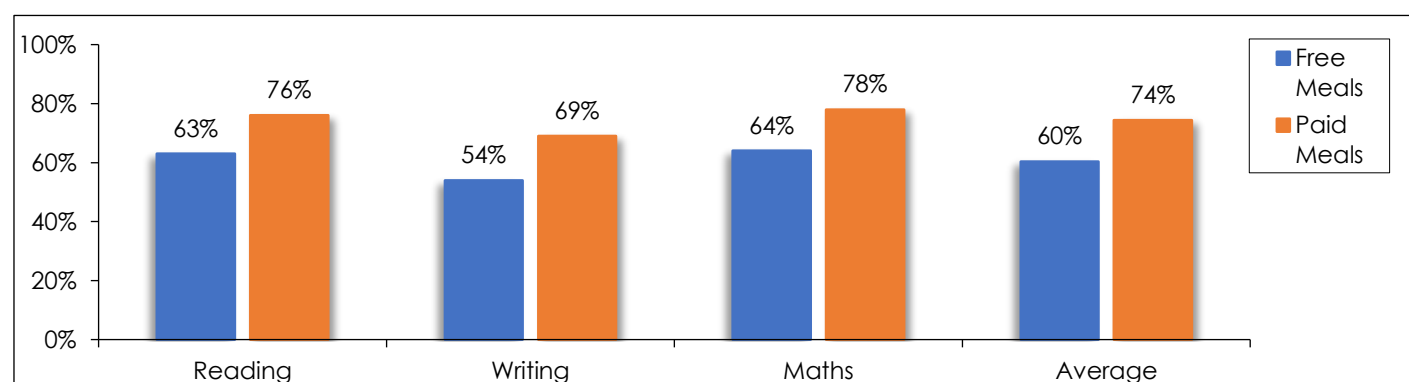

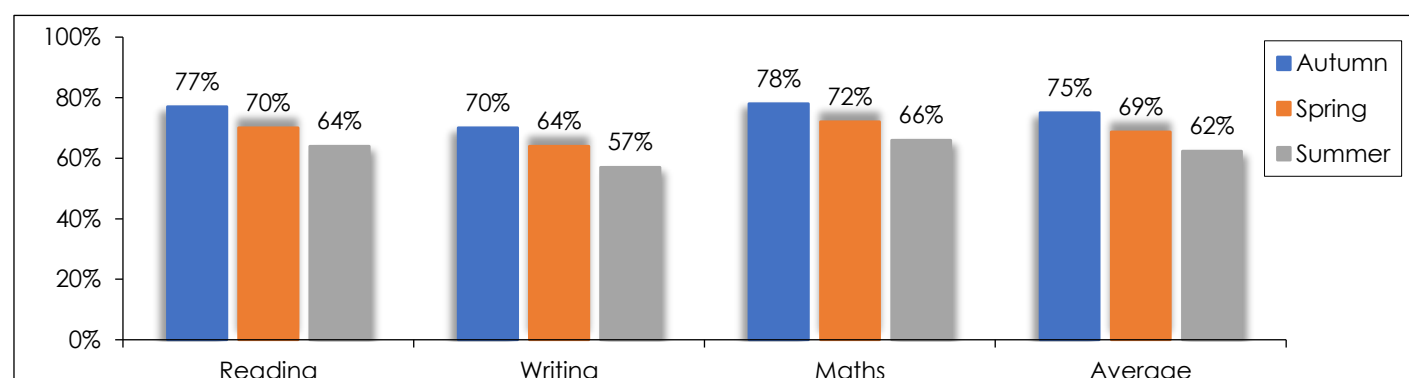
#### KS1 Performance by Gender (% expected or above)



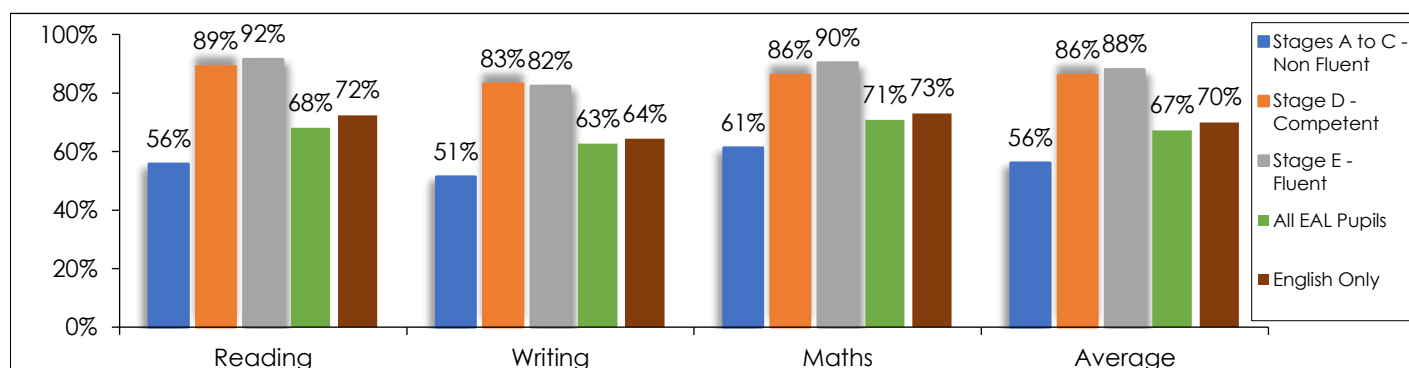
#### KS1 Performance by Meals Status (% expected or above)



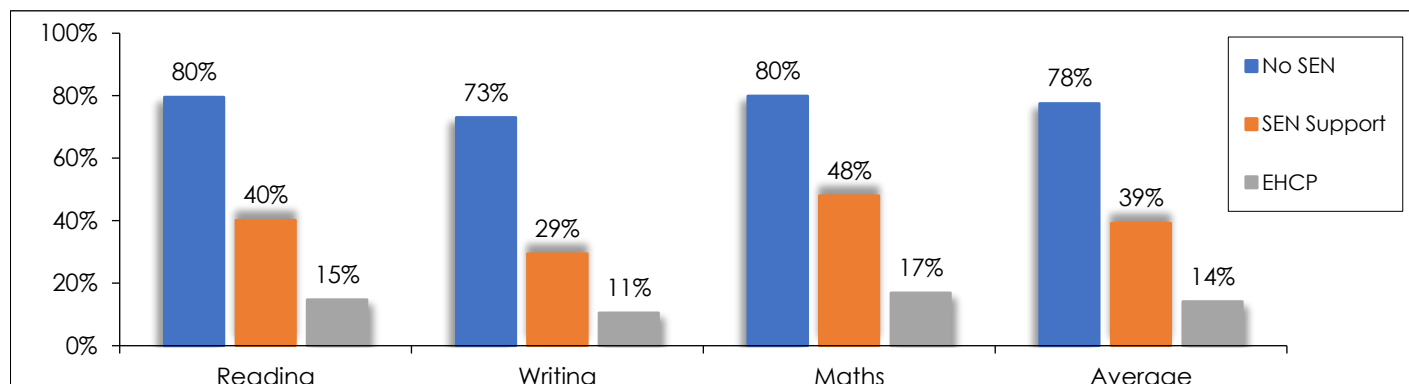
#### KS1 Performance by Term of Birth (% expected or above)

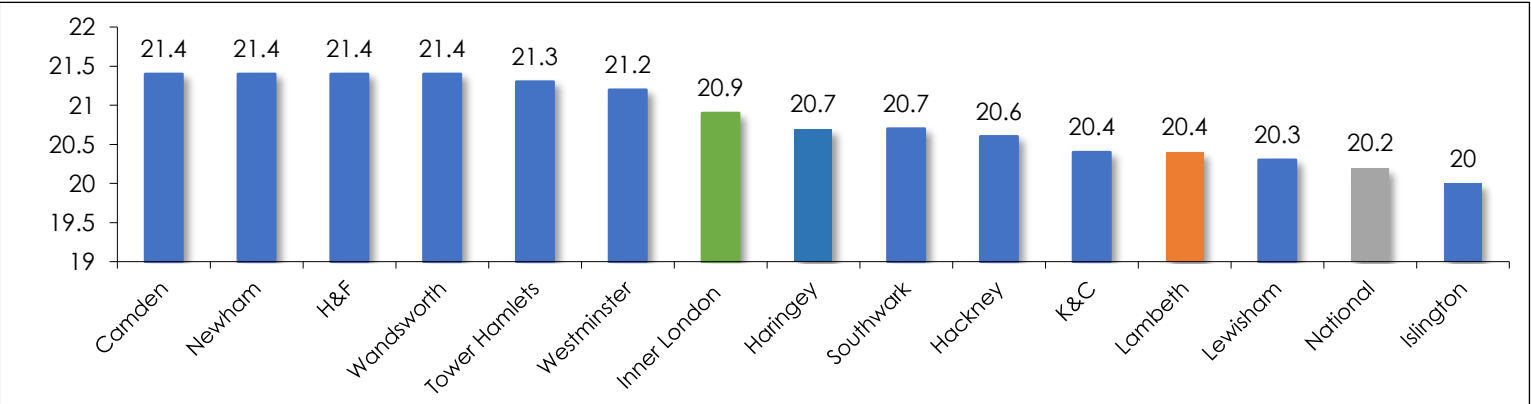

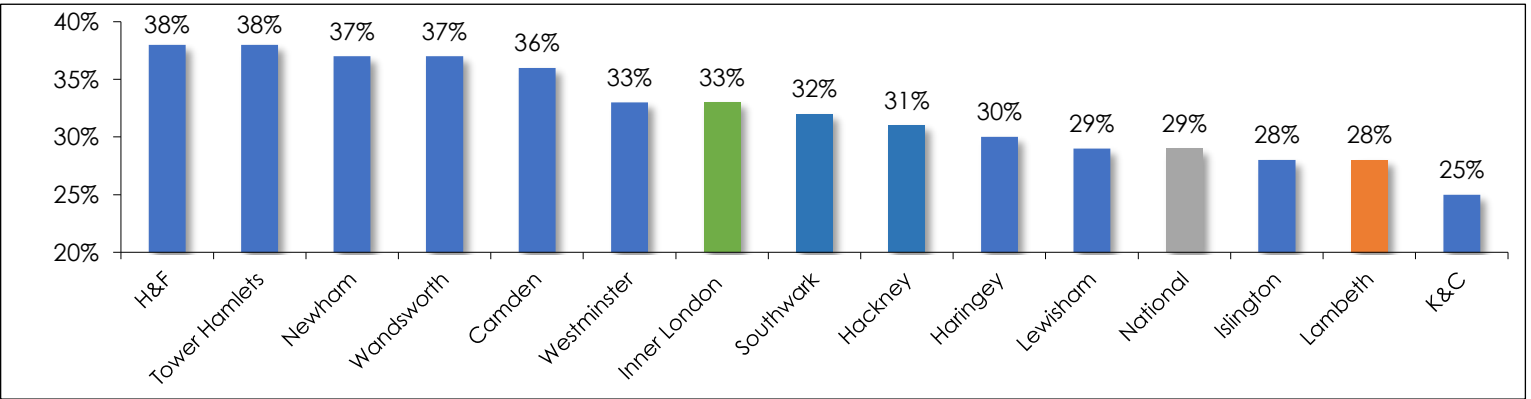

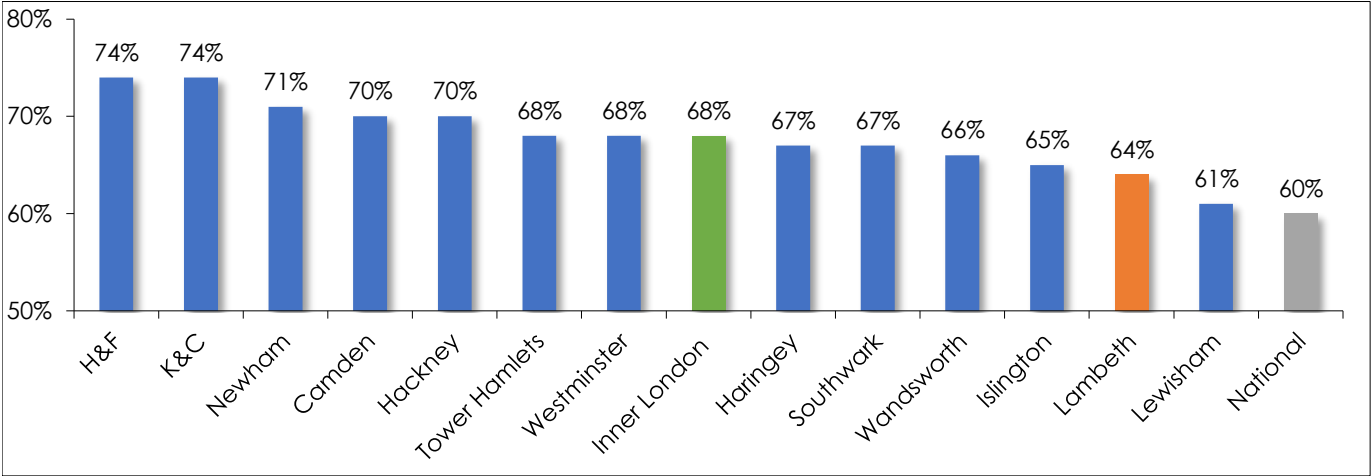

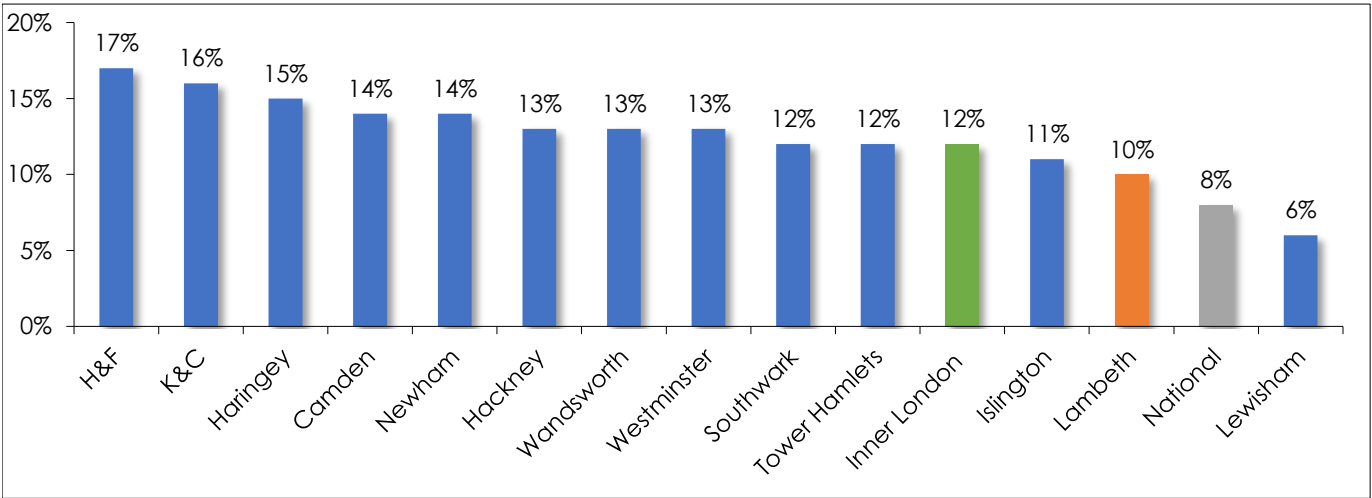

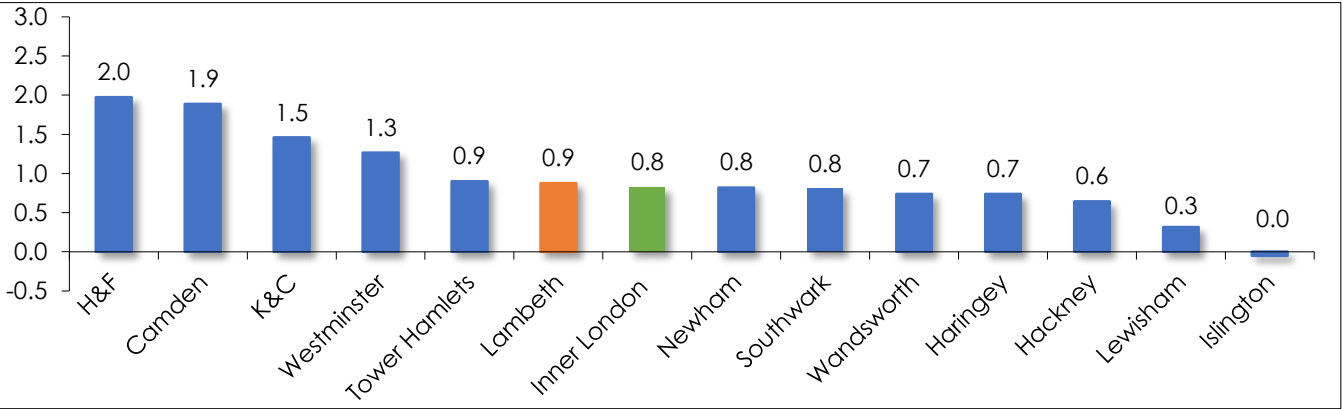

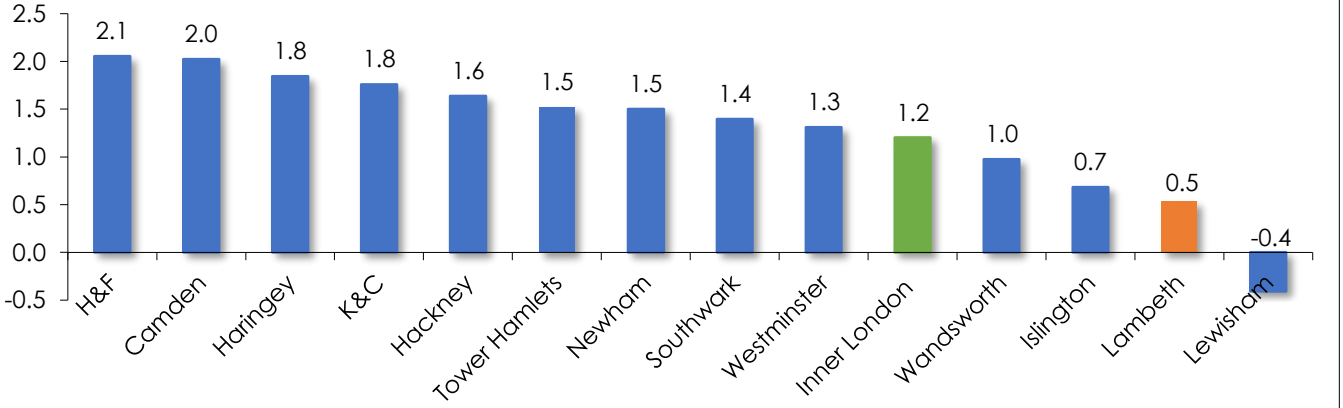

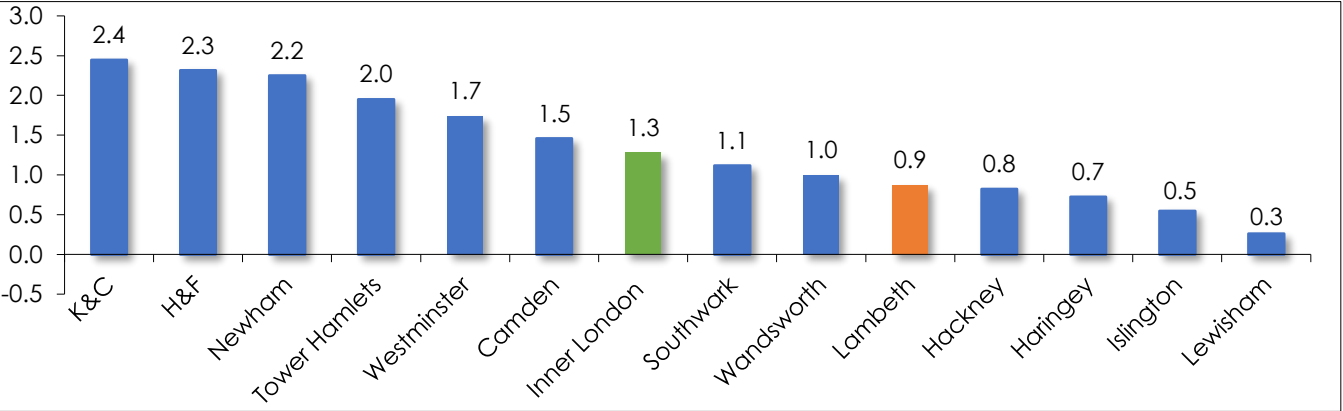
Progress score in Reading by Inner London Borough, 2023 (%)

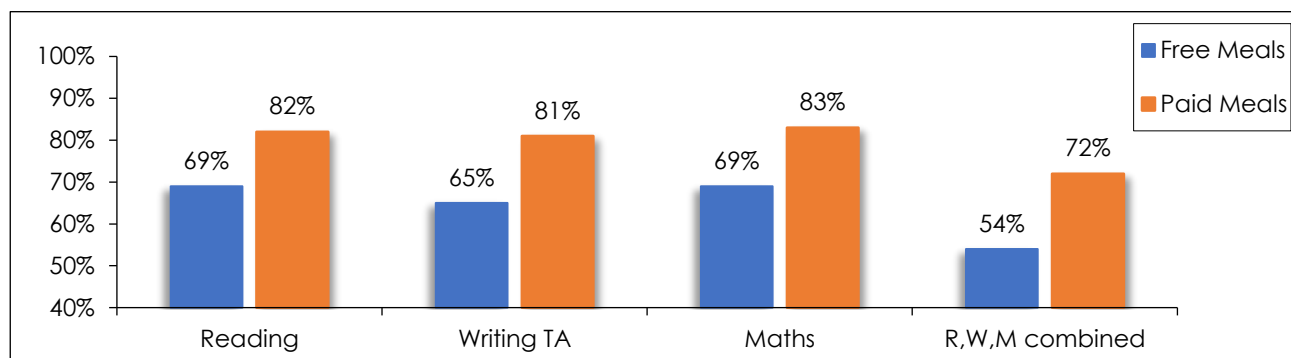

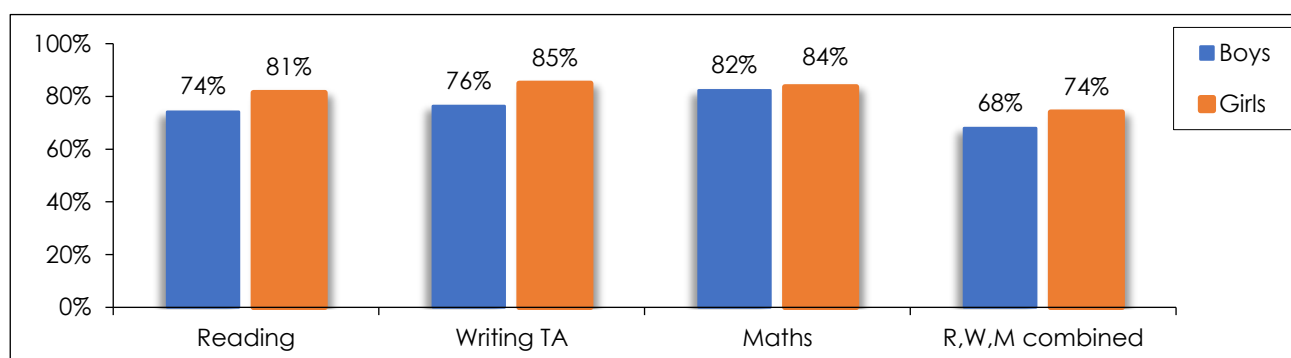

### Key Stage 2 Performance by Socio-Economic Indicators, 2023

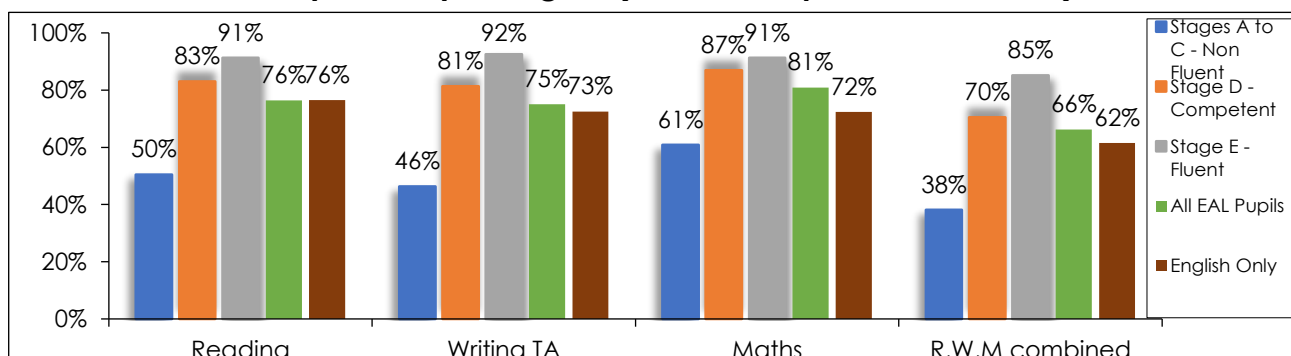
#### KS2 Performance by Free School Meals (% at the expected standard)



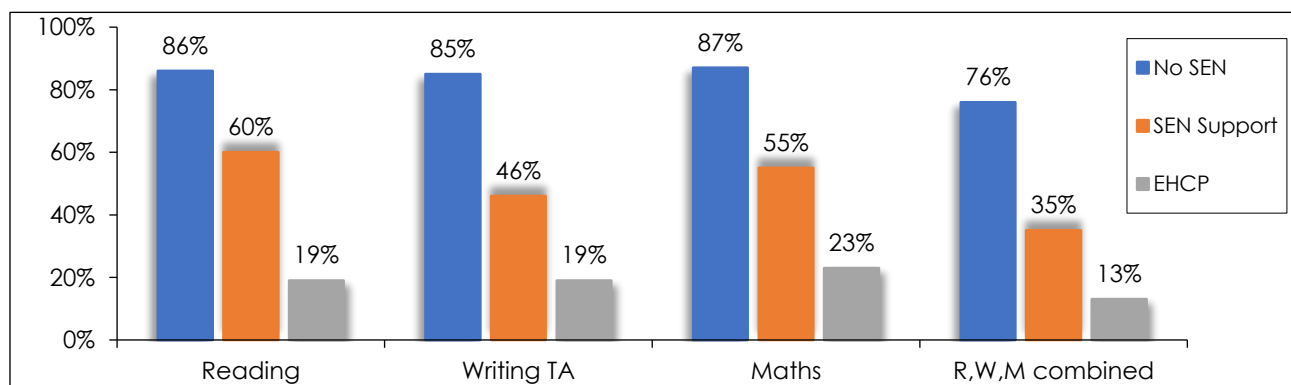
#### KS2 Performance by Gender (% at the expected standard)

Grade 5 in the new grading system is a similar level of achievement to a high grade C or low grade B in the old system (referred to as 'strong' achievement). Grade 4 or above is referred to as 'standard' achievement.

\*Progress 8 is not the most appropriate performance measure for UTCs and some FE colleges, hence why South Bank does not have a description judgement next to its measure.

**Attainment 8.** This score is calculated using a pupil's best eight GCSE results, then averaging the results for the overall school figure. If the Attainment 8 score is divided by 10 this gives an average grade. Therefore, an Attainment 8 score of 50 is equivalent to an average grade of 4 across all eight subjects.

**Progress 8.** This score shows how much progress pupils at this school made between the end of key stage 2 and the end of key stage 4, compared to pupils across England who got similar results at the end of key stage 2. This is based on results in up to 8 qualifications, which include English and maths. When interpreting scores it is important to note that a score of +1.00 is equivalent to a pupil, institution or socio-economic group achieving on average one grade higher than pupils with a similar KS2 starting point nationally. Equally, -1.00 is one grade lower, +0.20 one fifth grade higher, -0.53 about a half grade lower and so on.

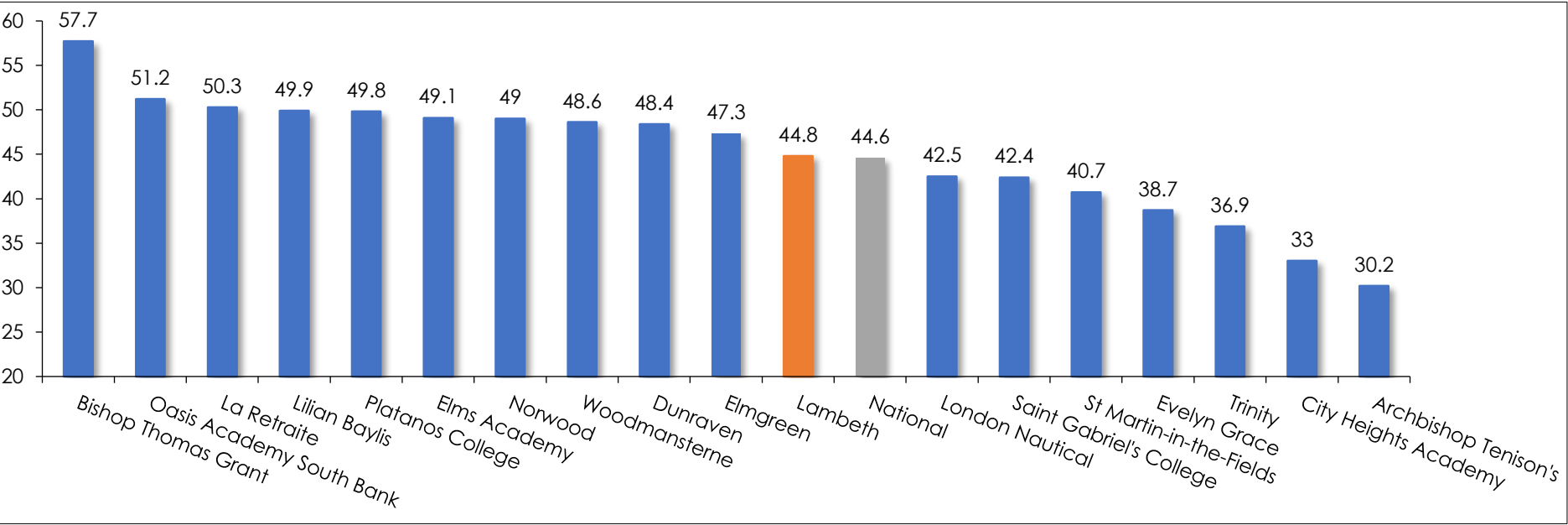

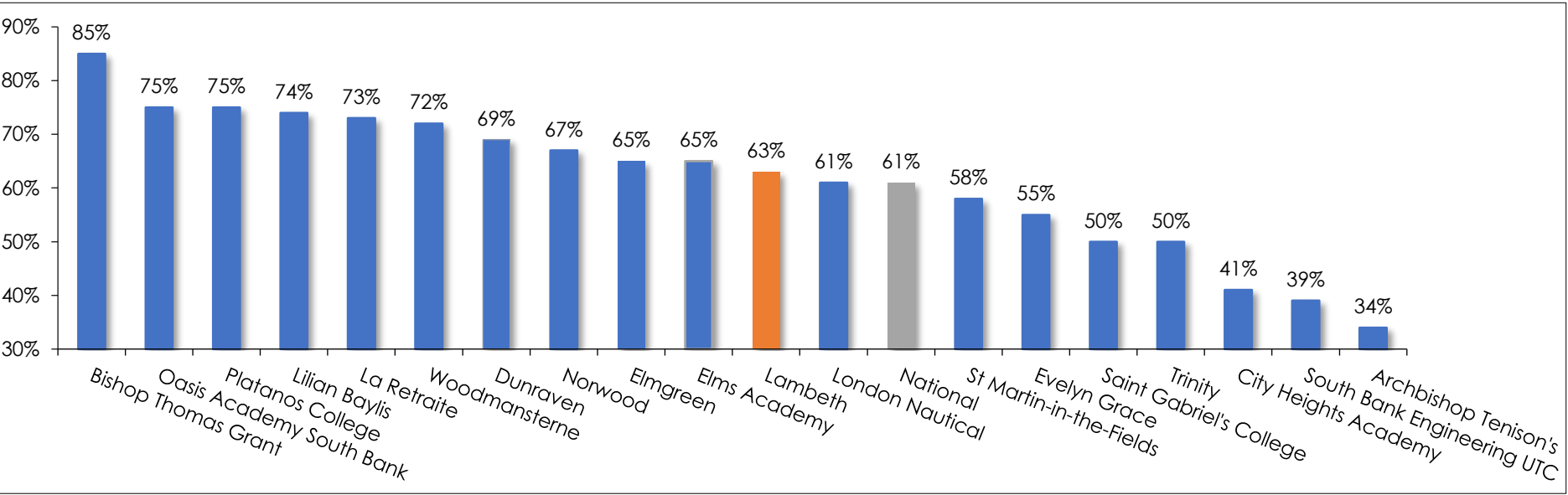

GCSE Performance, 2023 (End of KS4 pupils)

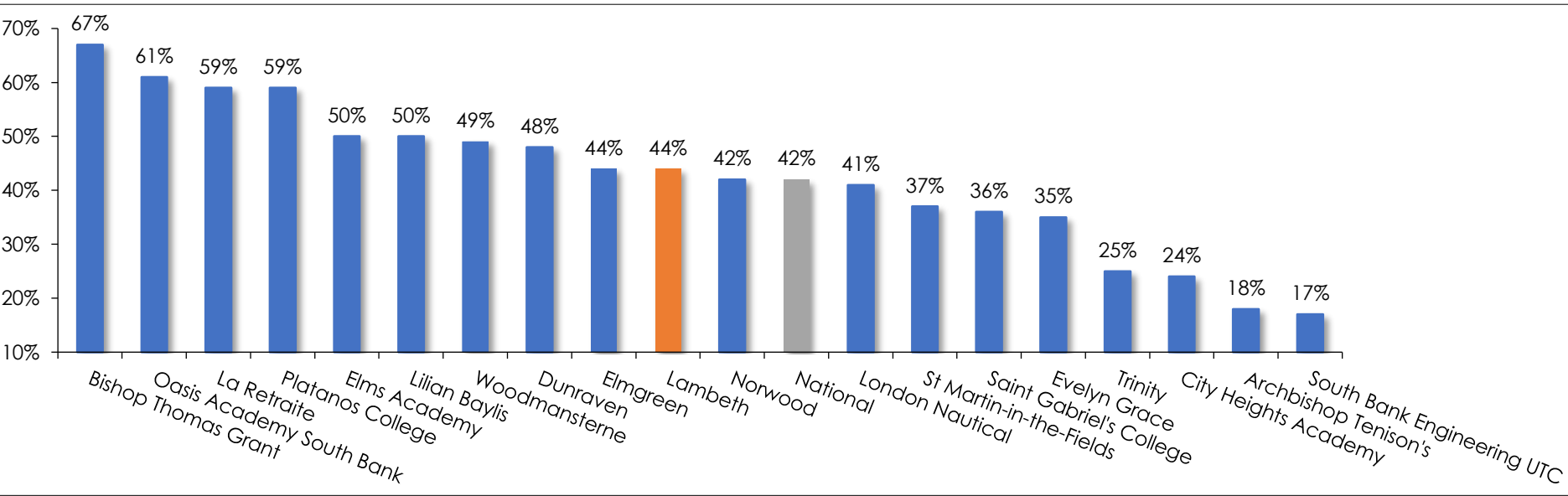
GCSE Attainment 8 Scores by school, 2023

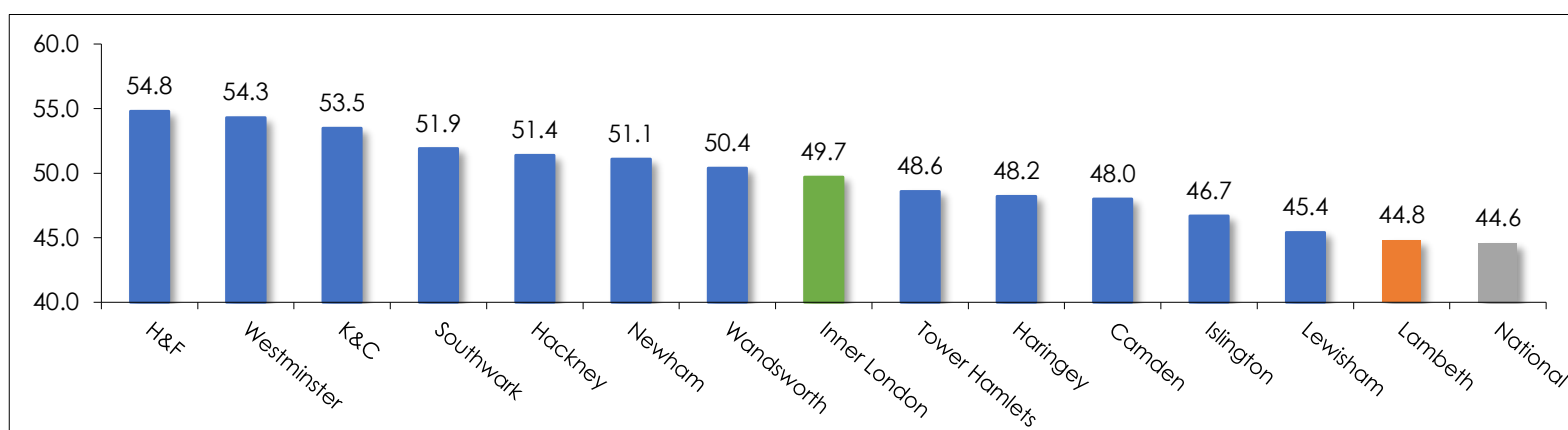

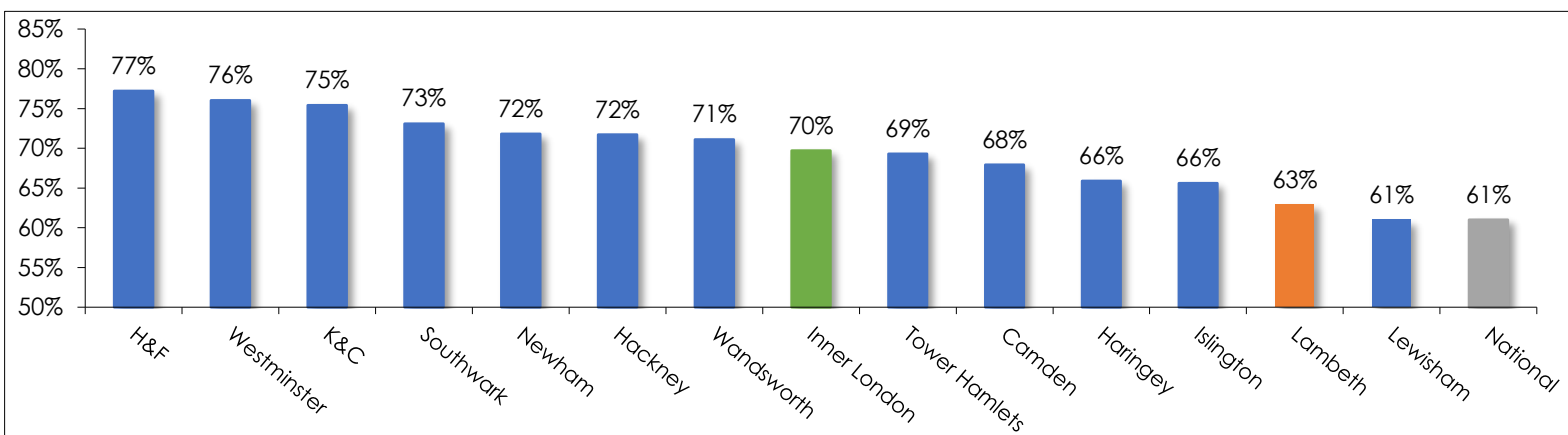

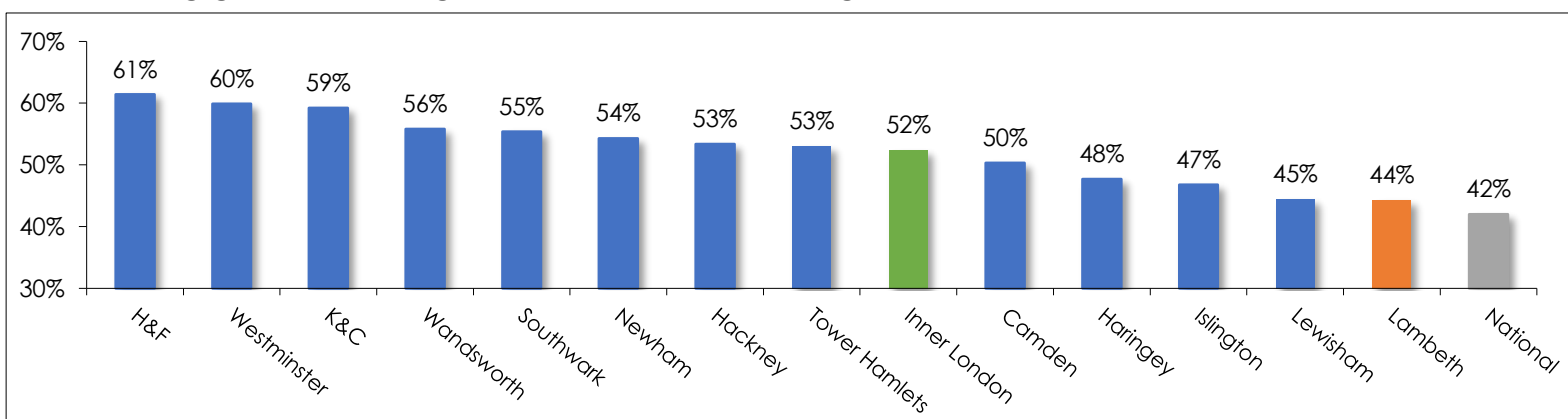
### Average Attainment 8 Score

Ebacc threshold - as of 2018 the DfE now use average points score as the headline Ebacc measure. Ebacc APS measures pupils' point scores across the five pillars of the Ebacc (English, maths, sciences, humanities and languages). This ensures the attainment of all pupils is recognised, not just those at particular grade boundaries, encouraging schools to enter pupils of all abilities.

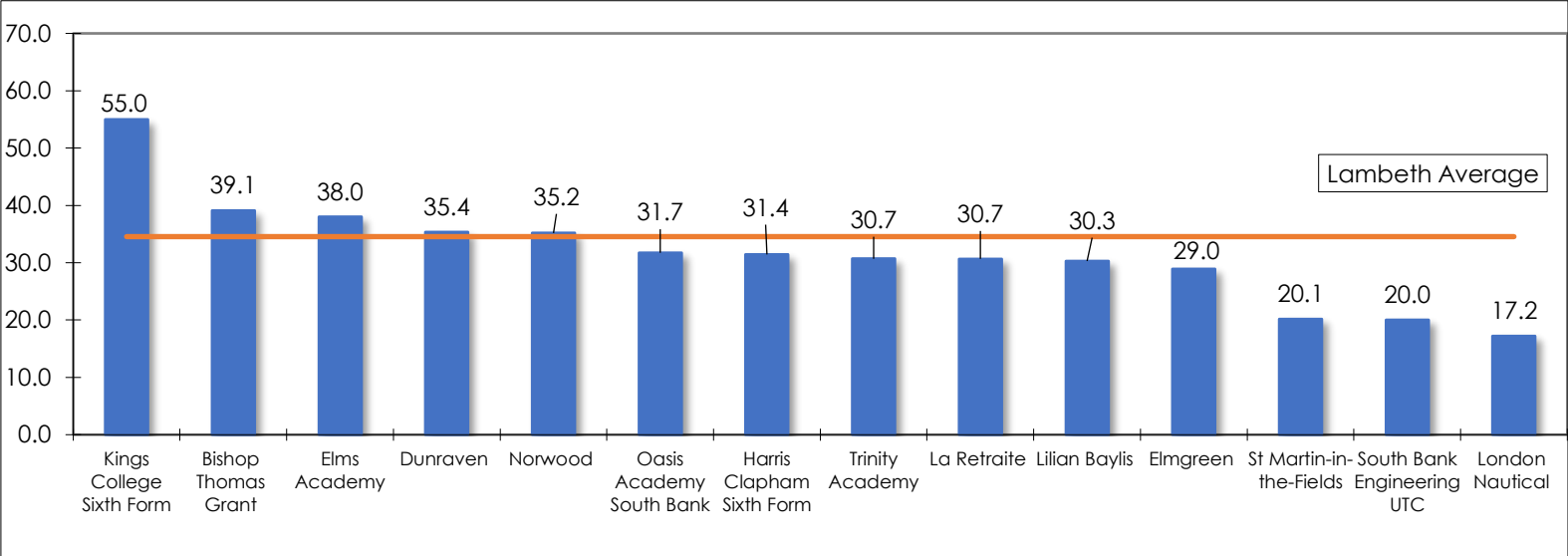

Applied generals are qualifications that provide broad study of a vocational area. They are designed to lead to higher education and they include areas such as performing arts, business and health and social care.

Technical levels are level 3 qualifications for students wishing to develop the specialist skills and knowledge for a technical occupation or industry. They lead to recognised occupations, for example in engineering, IT, accounting or professional cookery.

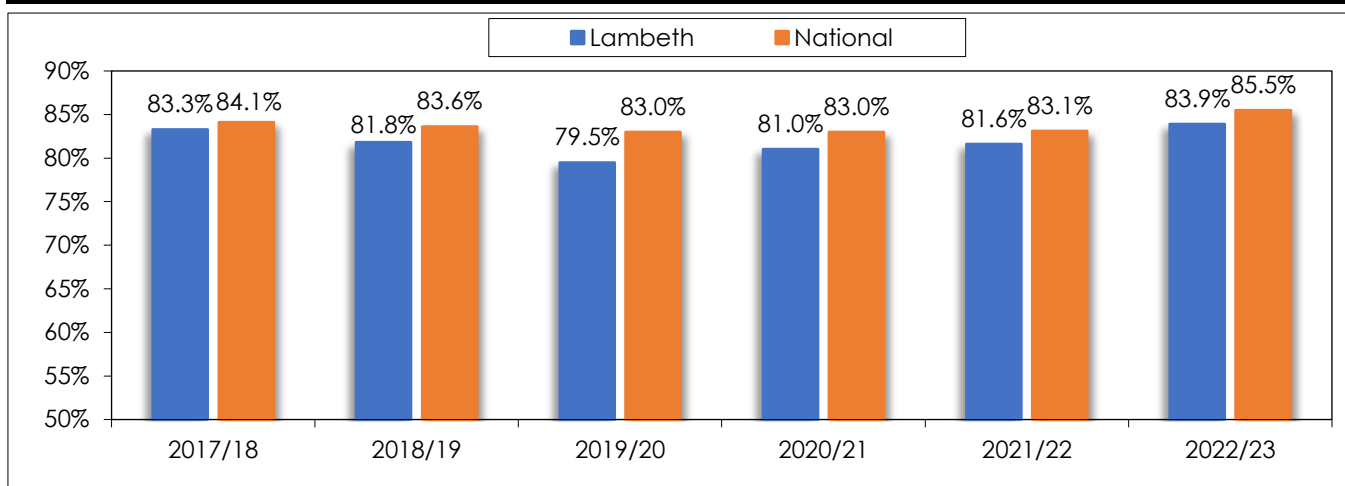

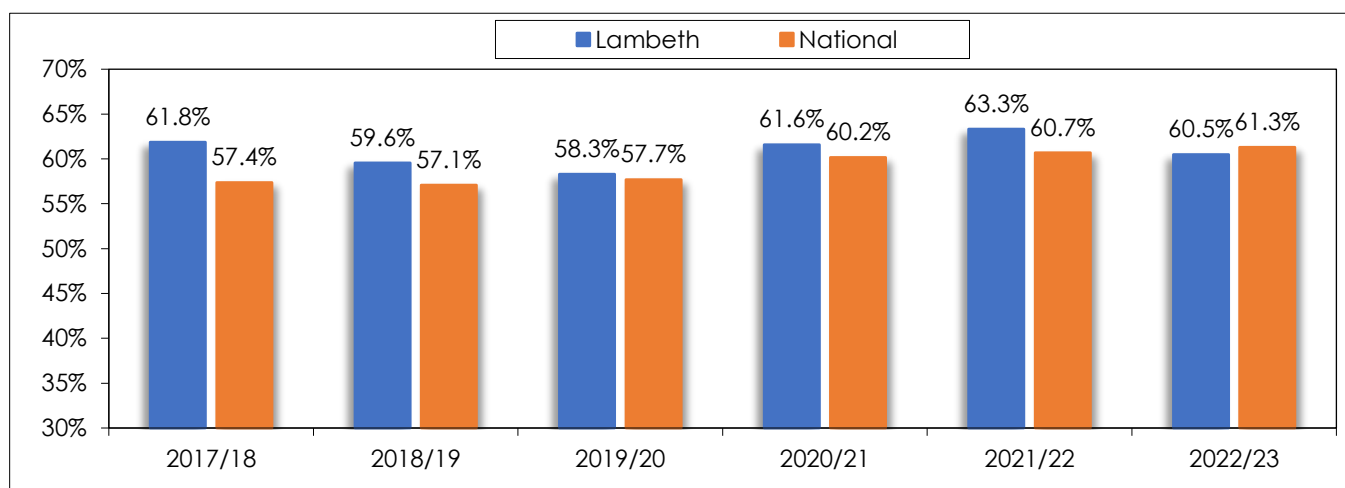
