Results of Statutory Consultation and Implementation

Dear Resident/Business

The purpose of this leaflet is to let you know the outcome of the statutory consultation carried out in September / October 2024 on the proposed Streatham Hill East Controlled Parking

Zone extension.

All representations received along with officers' recommendations were presented in a report which was considered by the Council. We would like to thank you for your participation in the consultation and for your feedback.

After careful consideration a decision has been made to proceed with the extension of the Streatham Hill East CPZ (Zone M) to be operational Monday to Friday between 10am to 12noon.

It was also decided introduce a new Streatham Wells CPZ (Zone SW) to be operational Monday to Friday between 10am and 4pm.

What happens next?

The final Traffic Management Orders (TMOs), which allow the restrictions to be implemented and administered, will be published in the London Gazette and the local newspaper (South London Weekly) shortly. The Streatham Hill CPZ extension will be operational from **31 March 2025.** A copy of the public notice has been enclosed.

Implementation Works

Lining and signing works for the Streatham Hill East CPZ extension will start in the week commencing **10 February 2025** and will last approximately 7 weeks, weather permitting.

Works will be carried out Monday to Friday between 7am and 4.30pm and on Saturdays between 8am and 1pm. When and where necessary, "no parking" cones and warning signs will put in place between 24 and 48 hours prior to work being undertaken to indicate the areas where parking will be prohibited. On the days where work is being undertaken in your street, please avoid parking where "no parking" cones and signage have been put in place to allow for the lining and post installation works to proceed efficiently.

Temporary Traffic Orders will be in place to support the "no parking" cones and signage. Vehicles parked on the coned areas run the risk of receiving a Penalty Charge Notice and possible relocation. If your vehicle is relocated, please contact Towed Vehicle Tracing Service (TRACE) customer services helpdesk on 0300 077 0100. Vehicles will be allowed back onto the road once the work is complete and where the cones and warning signs have been removed.

The Council is conscious of the disruption that this work may cause and will endeavour to keep the impact to a minimum. We therefore appreciate your cooperation and apologise in advance for any inconvenience that may be caused.

Prior to the CPZs being fully operational, which is currently envisaged to be **31 March 2025**, warning notices will be put in place in the area confirming the start date.

Do I have to pay to park in the CPZ?

Any resident living in or business located in the CPZ who owns a car and wants to park on the public highway during the hours of control will need a parking permit for the CPZ.

Residents will also be able to buy visitor vouchers for their guests to be able to park in designated bays, or trader vouchers so that works (such as renovations or landscaping) can be done at their properties. Any motorist visiting the neighbourhood to access shops or services can make use of short-term parking provisions, which means they pay only for the time they're parked in the area. If you park your vehicle off street on your driveway/private property you would not require a parking permit.

Where can I park?

Motorists who have purchased a valid permit will be able to be parked in marked bays on the public highway which allow permit holders' use within the CPZ as shown in the plan overleaf. Please check signs before parking.

How do I apply for a parking permit/voucher?

All information relating to parking permits/vouchers, such as the pricing structure and the application process can found on the Council website at www.lambeth.gov.uk/parking-permit.

The quickest and easiest method to apply for a permit is to complete an online application, however, if you prefer to complete a permit application by post or in person, please call the Lambeth Contact Centre on 020 7926 9000 for further information or to book an appointment.

<u>PLEASE NOTE</u>: Applications for permits will not be accepted before **1 March 2025**. Your address won't appear on the permit system until this date.

Pay by Phone

For short or unplanned visits, when you may not have any visitors vouchers to hand, visitors can park for up to a maximum of 4 hour in shared-use bays by calling, texting or using the mobile phone Pay by Phone application. Further details on Pay by Phone can be found at www.paybyphone.co.uk
