Tree Planting Highlights Winter 2024/25 (Oct-Mar)

- Total Trees Planted: 2,000
 - Street Trees: 1.400
 - Council Estates: 207

Coming together to build **Living Wage Places**

Lambeth hosted the second annual Living Wage Places Conference at Lambeth Town Hall on 22 May 2025.

Lambeth is working towards securing Living Wage Place accreditation this year, with the support of a steering group of local businesses.

Becoming a Living Wage Place means the borough will be recognised as a place where the role of good jobs and fair pay (the Living Wage hourly pay rate is based on independently assessed fairness criteria) is widely understood to be a sustainable means of supporting our residents through the cost-of-living crisis. This ties in with Lambeth's ambition to "Make Lambeth A Place We Can All Call Home", laid out in our 2030 borough plan: Our Future, Our Lambeth.

The theme of the day, "Living Wage Places Unlocked" - was designed to share learning and enable peer-to-peer dialogue about using collective knowledge to amplify local impact.

The conference brought together Living Wage Places Local Action Group members from local authorities all across the UK. Some are on the journey to become Living Wage Places; some have already been accredited by the Living Wage Foundation.



Juvenis: A Year of **Impact and Recognition**

Lambeth's Civic Awards celebrated the local heroes who make Lambeth a better place at an awards ceremony in the Town Hall.

Lambeth's Civic Awards are the council's opportunity to publicly recognise outstanding contributions to the borough, and the work and organisations that are the heart and soul of the borough.

The awards were relaunched in 2024 to recognise and celebrate the incredible work that Lambeth's individuals, charities,



voluntary sector, and businesses do to help others.


Where do you live and for how long have you lived there?

I've lived in Brixton, just off Brixton Hill, since 2002. My wife and I moved down from Durham where we'd lived for nearly thirty years, to be nearer the head office of the company I worked for, but also to experience some capital city buzz after the gentility of the University and Cathedral city of Durham.

How did you get involved with the Community?

I've always been involved in my community wherever I've lived. In Durham I was very active in my Church, where my wife ran a Fair-Trade shop. As soon as we arrived in Brixton, we joined Holy Trinity Tulse Hill, and I joined the Brixton Hill Branch of the Labour Party.

We also became Friends of Windmill Gardens, where I





When did you get involved in politics?

My memory is a little hazy here, but I distinctly remember campaigning in Putney for Labour in the 1966 election. But I think it started before that: In 1956 - I did my basic training for National Service in Ashton-under-Lyme, a deprived suburb of Manchester.

As a privileged middle-class boy from North London, it was the first time I'd come across the debilitating effects of poverty, and that made me want to do something to address the inequality that was all around.

What changes would you like to see in Lambeth?

Since I came to Lambeth I've seen a vast amount of change - just look at all the new buildings along Brixton Hill. Some call it 'gentrification' and deplore it - but I've seen a borough fight its way up from having shabby pockets of deprivation to a buzzing centre of multiculturalism, a community that provides sanctuary to asylum seekers and support for our elderly and vulnerable, and puts the environment and the protection of women and girls at the top of its priorities.

So those are the continuing changes I'd like to see: improved harmony among all the different groups, increased community activity, plus of course, more trees, fewer cars and more activities for the elderly and the young.

Favourite place in Lambeth?

I love wandering all round Lambeth – from the South Bank in the North, to Rookery Gardens in the South, and I particularly enjoy the parks, such as Windmill Gardens, Brockwell Park, and Rush Common, which I've had so much to do with. But really, I'm a city person – so it's got to be a building, so I'll vote for my current place of work – the Town Hall.

What do I like to do on a free evening?

As I thought of the answer to that one, several pleasures came to mind: evenings in the pub after a Labour Group or Church meeting; going by myself to a cheap seat at the London Coliseum to see English National Opera; cooking myself a complicated meal with an air fryer, a cooker and a microwave. But what I think gives me most pleasure is to go out with friends, or to visit them for a drink or a meal.

Motto

I originally thought of "If I can help somebody as I go my way, then my life will have not been in vain", but although that sums up my overall objectives, it is a bit pretentious (to say nothing of naff).

Actually, as I tend to panic and flap and get all het up about anything, – I've recently adopted a motto that seems to fix everything. It's: "All the time in the world" - and when I'm trying to do three things at once, and forgetting what two of them are, I say it to myself, and do them one at a time, and calm returns.

Safe road, safe way home

Meet the team helping young people stay safe after school.

A new campaign has been launched to help young people stay safe on the school run. The campaign highlights the council's Youth Engagement Service - youth workers who patrol the borough and engage with young people, connecting them with local youth groups and support services. Young people are encouraged to stop, say hello

and find out what the YES team have to offer.

The YES team are part of a major programme to reduce robbery and violence in Lambeth, supported by funding from the Mayor's Violence Reduction Unit. This includes the deployment of additional CCTV to hot-spots, engagement with hospitality venues and partnership working with the Met and British Transport police.



Last year, violence with injury reduced by 15%*, an important sign of progress as the vital work to make young people safer continues across our communities.






LAMBETH MARKS WINDRUSH DAY

Lambeth Council and local organisations are coming together to celebrate Windrush Day 2025 with a borough-wide programme honouring the Windrush Generation and their descendants.

On Windrush Day, Sunday 22 June, the square will host the annual Big Caribbean Lunch for Windrush elders, a vibrant Caribbean market, live music and film screenings. Celebrations begin on Saturday 21 June with dominoes matches hosted by the Brixton Immortals.















Neighbourhoods Fit for the Future:

Transforming Hercules Road

Hercules Road in Waterloo has been transformed into a greener, calmer, and more sustainable space through a collaboration between Lambeth Council, WeAreWaterloo BID (WAW BID), and the South Bank and Waterloo Neighbours (SoWN) Forum. A new green space—roughly the size of a tennis court—now features trees, cycle parking, and public seating for community use.

The project improves air quality and reduces the urban heat island effect by replacing tarmac with planting areas and depaved surfaces. Modified kerbs help capture rainwater, lowering flood risk. Three large green buildouts on the eastern side and two smaller ones on the western side include over a dozen trees, 15 seats, and six bike racks. WAW BID coordinated additional planting and will maintain the greenery.

Funded by Lambeth Council, WAW BID, SoWN, the Mayor of London's Air Quality Fund, and Cross River Partnership, the scheme was launched on 15 May with a community event featuring a pottery workshop by Mud Gang and refreshments from Eden Caterers.

Cllr Rezina Chowdhury, Deputy Leader and Cabinet Member for Sustainable Lambeth and Clean Air, said: "It's great to see schemes like this shaped by the local community. The new trees and shading will offer accessible spaces for residents to cool off in summer."

This project aligns with Lambeth's Climate Action Plan and Kerbside Strategy, which aim to reallocate 25% of kerbside space to greening and climate resilience.

Rain Gardens and the Soak Up Lambeth Programme

Lambeth has also introduced sustainable drainage systems (SuDS), or rain gardens, near Archbishop's and Jessop Primary Schools. These initiatives form part of the broader Soak Up Lambeth programme, targeting improved drainage and biodiversity across the borough.

Projects at St Matthews Estate, Effra Road, Norwood Park, Myatts Field, and Claremont estates use native planting to manage water flow and create habitats. Funded by Lambeth's Capital Investment Programme and supported by Thames Water, the programme contributes to the borough's goal of managing 10% of rainwater on impermeable surfaces by 2030.



All aboard! Lambeth Together listening in our communities

Since October, leaders from Lambeth Together have been joining Lambeth's Health and Wellbeing Bus to listen to what matters most to people about their health and care.

While health champions, nurses and specialist advisers offer advice, blood pressure checks and information on local support, board members listen to people's experiences of health and care services, and what is most important to them and their families. People's views are shared back to Lambeth Together Care

Partnership Board to ensure their priorities are reflected in local plans for health and care.

Folake said: "It was a great opportunity to listen to residents, and it prompted some valuable discussions at the board. Issues that came up included housing, control of health conditions like diabetes and high blood pressure, and pain management. I also heard really positive feedback about the support people are getting from their GPs."

The Board on the Bus is one activity of the Lambeth Together board's listening programme. This also includes a public forum every two months, and a marquee at the Lambeth Country Show.



NEW HOMES

Under new plans being considered, Lambeth Council is aiming to increase the number of new affordable homes that could be delivered on the Westbury Estate in Clapham.

The project is currently seeking a development partner to help the council bring forward the next phase of new homes, in addition to the 64 new social rent homes that have been built already on phase 1 in 2021.

Previous regeneration plans included only redeveloping the low-rise buildings on the estate, but due to their age, conditions, and high maintenance costs, the council is now planning to include the two high-rise towers on the estate, Amesbury and Durrington Towers, into the wider estate plans and therefore create

more opportunities for more residents living on the estate.

Councillor Danny Adilypour, Deputy Leader of the Council and Member for Housing, Investment and New Homes, said: "Lambeth has a pressing need for more new homes to reduce the number of people on our housing waiting list.

"Where we can, we are being bolder and more ambitious by seeking the maximum number of affordable homes that can be delivered on our housing projects and provide them with new high-quality homes.

"At Westbury, we have the opportunity to significantly increase the number of new homes that can be built but also enable more residents who have lived in this neighbourhood to benefit from new high-quality homes and improved

community facilities and open spaces."

Following formal approval, the Amesbury and Durrington Towers are planned to be included in the next stage of the procurement process for a development partner to deliver the Westbury Estate regeneration. The process is due to complete later this year.

The development partner appointed will work with residents to create new plans and designs for the estate redevelopment thereafter which they will have a chance to vote on through a resident ballot.
