

How long do I have to give feedback?

The consultation runs for 3 months from 15th August 2016 to 11pm on 15th November 2016.

Do I have to fill in the online form to respond to the consultation?

Apart from using the online form, you can also pick up a paper feedback form from Lambeth libraries. Please ask a member of library staff for a form. Once you have finished your response, you can leave it with a member of library staff. We will be collecting all paper forms on a regular basis.

You can also attend one of our evening drop-in sessions and speak to a Lambeth officer. The drop-in sessions will be held:

- on 15 September 2016, 6pm - 8pm at Roots & Shoots Hall, Walnut Tree Walk, Kennington, SE11 6DN
- on 28 September 2016 between 6pm - 8pm at Streatham Tate Library, 63 Streatham High Road, Streatham, SW16 1PN

What happens after the consultation closes on 15th November 2016?

When the consultation has ended we will consider all comments and finalise the action plan. The plan will then be sent to Cabinet and subsequently to the Mayor of London for final approval. Afterwards the plan will be published on our website.

How did you come up with this plan?

The plan was written by Lambeth's Sustainability team based on a template from the Greater London Authority with suggestions and feedback from a number of Lambeth residents, Business Improvement Districts and various council departments, including Public Health, Planning, Transport, Regeneration, Education & Learning, Procurement and Housing. This consultation is on a draft version of the plan.

How will you ensure that this plan is being followed?

There will be a steering group, which will meet every 3 months. The group will be responsible for reviewing the Action Plan, adding new actions when necessary and ensuring that the Plan is being followed. The group will include Lambeth residents, businesses and organisations as well as representatives from various Lambeth Council departments, including Public Health, Planning, Transport and Regeneration. Other public bodies such as the Greater London Authority and Transport for London will also be invited to join the group. Why is this plan for Lambeth only and not for the whole of London?

We have a statutory duty to produce an Air Quality Action Plan for the borough, as we are an Air Quality Management Area for Nitrogen Dioxide and Particulate Matter. Lambeth, like all London boroughs, is part of the London Local Air Quality Management (LLAQM) system. The Greater London Authority (GLA) manages LLAQM and approves all Action Plans. Furthermore, this Action Plan is based on a template written by the GLA, which all London boroughs are encouraged to use, so that the actions can be replicated across London. Also, our plan has actions to work jointly with other London boroughs to tackle poor air quality.
