#### **EXTENSION OF CONSERVATION AREA: PARISH OF THORPE ST ANDREW**

NOTICE is hereby given that the Broadland District Council, at its meeting on 17 December 2007, in pursuance of their powers under the above Act, have designated two areas of land in the parish of Thorpe St Andrew as an extension to the Thorpe St Andrew Conservation Area, being an area of special architectural and historic interest the character or appearance of which it is desirable to preserve or enhance. All of which areas are designated on a plan kept at the offices of Broadland District Council, Thorpe Lodge, Yarmouth Road, Norwich, NR7 0DL, where it may be inspected free of charge by members of the public during normal office hours and where copies of the plan may be obtained.

The principal effects of such designation are that:

(i) Consent must be obtained from the relevant Planning Authority for the demolition of any building in the Area;

(ii) It is a criminal offence for any person proposing to cut down, top, lop, uproot, willfully damage or willfully destroy any tree in the Area except with the consent of the relevant Planning Authority. To obtain the relevant consent, the person proposing to do any work on trees in the Area is required to give six weeks prior notification in writing to the relevant Planning Authority of their intention, unless the trees are already protected by a tree preservation order, in which case an application for consent is required;

(iii) proposals for the preservation and enhancement of the Area will be published by the relevant Planning Authority at the appropriate time;

(iv) Permitted development rights are more restricted in the Area than in other areas;

(v) Any person wishing to display an illuminated advertisement in the Area must do so without the express consent of the relevant Planning Authority;

(vi) In carrying out its functions under the Planning Acts and in particular determining applications for planning permission and listed building consent, the relevant Planning Authority will take into account the desirability of preserving or enhancing the character or appearance of the area;

The objective of designation is to preserve or enhance the character or appearance of areas of special architectural or historic interest, distinct from individual buildings, to control developments in the area and to stimulate and encourage measures to improve the environment. The primary effects of conservation area status are the demolition of certain buildings is brought within conservation area control and consent must first be sought from the planning authority that it becomes an offence to cut down, lop or carry out any other works to certain trees within the area without prior consent from the planning authority; and that planning applications for development which in the opinion of the planning authority, would affect the character or appearance of the conservation area, must be advertised in a plan showing the areas subject to these designations is available!
