**LONDON BOROUGH OF LAMBETH  
CIVIC AMENITIES ACT, 1967  
(Designation of Conservation Areas).**

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of the London Borough of Lambeth in pursuance of their powers under Section I of the Civic Amenities Act 1967, has decided to extend certain areas which have already been designated as Conservation Areas within the London Borough of Lambeth as follows:—

\* Clapham No. 1.—Clapham Old Town and Clapham Common, including Crescent Grove and part of Rectory Grove. Add: St. Mary's Church and Monastery and frontages to Old Town and Clapham Common, South Side.

Kennington No. 8.—Part of Kennington Park Road, Cleaver Square, Cleaver Street, part of Kennington Lane, Chester Way, Denny Street, Denny Crescent, part of Kennington Road, parts of Black Prince Road and Sancerroft Street, Cardigan Street, Courtenay Street, Courtenay Square and part of Kennington Lane. Add: Kennington Green and Old Lambeth Town Hall.

Lambeth Palace No. 10.—Lambeth Palace and Associated Gardens and Park. Add: Up to and including the river frontage, but excluding any part of the river itself.

The object of designation is to preserve or enhance the character or appearance of areas of special architectural or historic interest as distinct from individual buildings to control developments in such areas and to stimulate and encourage measures to improve the environment.

Plans showing the extended areas are available for public inspection during normal office hours either at Room 113, Lambeth Town Hall, Brixton Hill, S.W.2, or at the offices of The Borough Architect and Town Planning Officer, 138/146 Clapham Park Road, S.W.4.
