

NOTICE OF APPLICATION FOR A REVIEW OF A PREMISES LICENCE UNDER THE GAMBLING ACT 2005

An application has been made under section 197 of the Gambling Act 2005 for a review of the premises licence which is in force in respect of the following premises:

William Hill, 122-124 Acre Lane, London SW2 5RJ

The following type of premises licence applies to the premises:

Gambling Premises Licence – Betting Shop (LBLam/GPrem24

A review is being sought on the following grounds:

Preventing gambling from being a source of a source of crime or disorder, being associated with crime or disorder or being used to support crime and, protecting vulnerable persons from being harmed or exploited by gambling.

Following the execution of a warrant by the Metropolitan Police under S.23 Misuse of Drugs Act 1971 on 17th March 2014 at William Hill, 122-124 Acre Lane SW2 5RJ, ten people were arrested. Five for possession with intent to supply cannabis, three for possession of cannabis and two members of staff for allowing the premises to be used for drug dealing. Alcohol was also being consumed on the premises. There was concern that vulnerable persons may be harmed by the consumption of drugs on the premises.

The application has been made on: 3rd April 2014.

The licence holder or a responsible authority may make representations in writing about the application, as may any of the following persons:

- A person who lives sufficiently close to the premises to be likely to be affected by the authorised activities
- A person who has business interests that might be affected by the authorised activities
- A person who represents someone in any of the above two categories

and may be made during the period of 28 consecutive days beginning 7 days after the date on which the application was made. That period ends on: **9th May 2014**

Information about the application is available from the licensing authority, including the arrangements for viewing the details of the application.

It is an offence under section 342 of the Gambling Act 2005 if a person, without reasonable excuse, gives to a licensing authority for a purpose connected with that Act information which is false or misleading.
