
- ensure the Hall's **sustainable future** by providing a vibrant space for the community to get together, while making the Hall more accessible for everyone to use it

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
### Who is involved?

The National Lottery Heritage Fund believes that understanding, valuing and sharing the history of the Hall will bring people together, inspire pride in the community and help to boost investment in the local economy.

The **Brockwell Park Community Partnership** has been vital in getting the project this far and making sure the concerns of the people who use the Hall the most are heard.

**Historic England** have been consulted to make sure that any changes to this historic asset are sensitive to its story.

**Consultation** has taken place and **pilot activities** are underway to make sure that the project connects the Hall with as many community groups as possible.




Plan showing Heritage Significance of the Hall and Stables.




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Do you perceive Brockwell Hall to be providing good community value?




Which age group visits the café most?

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### What are we proposing?

Lambeth Council, in partnership with Brockwell Park Community Partners, are preparing a proposal to the National Lottery Heritage Fund for a £3.3m contribution to a total investment of £5.7m to restore Brockwell Hall.

A new café and flexible community exhibition space will bring people into the Hall and tell the history of it and those that use it.

A new **Community Events Space** – built to support a range of activities and functions – and areas of the restored Hall will be available for both **public and commercial use**.


Parts of the Hall and Event Space will be closed on certain days for **weddings**, **functions** and **film/photo** shoots on which the Hall will depend for its future sustainability. The café will remain open for the public.



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
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




 $3\mbox{D}$  view showing café seating amongst an exhibition in the Picture Room.

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## What are we proposing?

The Hall will become **more accessible to all who use it**, with new landscaping around the Hall bringing a new stair and path to the main entrance, and with a new lift being installed in the building.

Cars, equipment and storage around the Hall will be moved down to a new location at the south end of Brockwell Park, making sure that the areas around the Hall **prioritise people**.

The new buildings will be constructed to the highest possible standard and, wherever possible, the **existing fabric will be improved** upon.


All issues regarding biodiversity, trees (arboricultural), transport, noise and archaeology have been considered as part of the planning application for the proposal.




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


Cross section showing sustainable design strategies for the new Community Events space.
