Appendix A – Consultation communications

1. Introduction

1.1 Background

In order to encourage more people to cycle and use cycling as a mode of transport, we have been helping residents who have nowhere to store their bikes by installing our specially designed secure Lambeth Bikehangars for them to rent. There are over 220 hangars installed in the borough.

1.2 Our proposals

The purpose of this consultation was to assess resident support for cycle hangar installations on 55 roads and streets in Lambeth.

2. The consultation

2.1 Consultation objectives

Our consultation objectives were to inform people in the affected streets as to the proposed locations of additional cycle hangars throughout the borough and for them to comment on the suitability of the proposals.

2.2 Who we consulted

We consulted residents of the 55 roads and streets affected by the proposals.

2.3 When we consulted

The consultation opened on 12 August 2019 and closed on 15 September 2019

2.4 How we consulted

2.4.1 Press activity

There was no specific press activity

2.4.2 Digital activity

Residents on affected streets were invited to take part in an online survey

2.4.3 Print activity

Letters were sent to residents of the affected streets, setting out the proposals for cycle hangar installations. The letters included drawings of the proposed locations.

2.4.4 Event activity

There were no events to support this consultation

3. Responses from members of the public

3.1 Summary of results

648 responses were received from the online survey. Some people in streets where there was not a proposal to install a cycle hangar still provided a response to the online survey. Not

everyone who responded to the survey provided the name of the street they lived on. Those who did provide this information stated that they lived on the following streets:

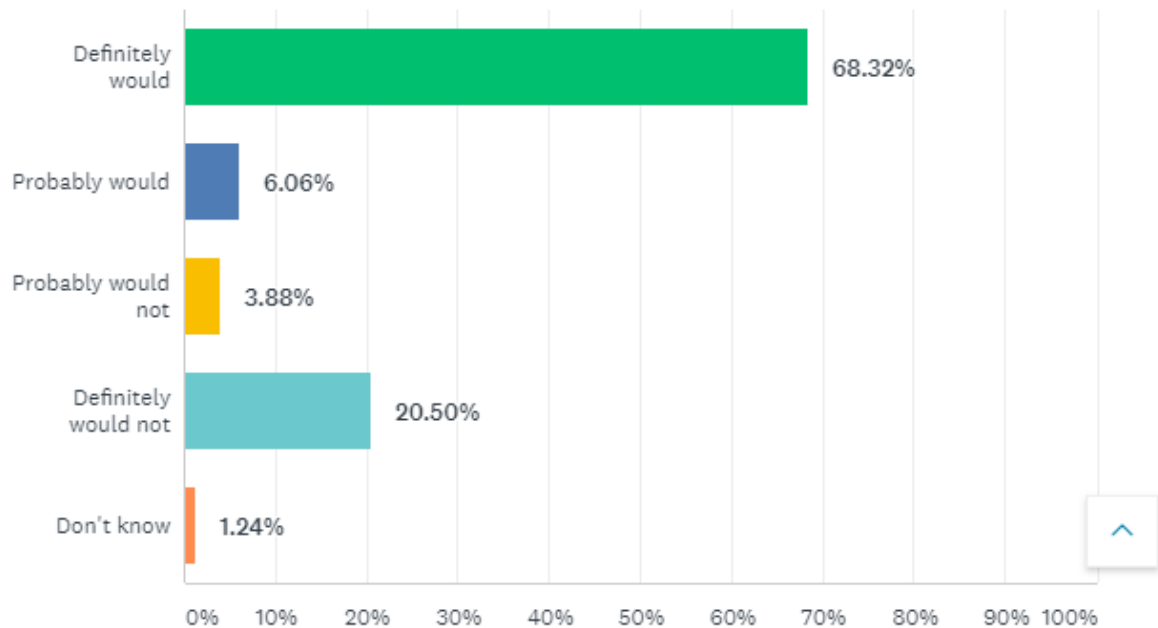

People responded in the following way:

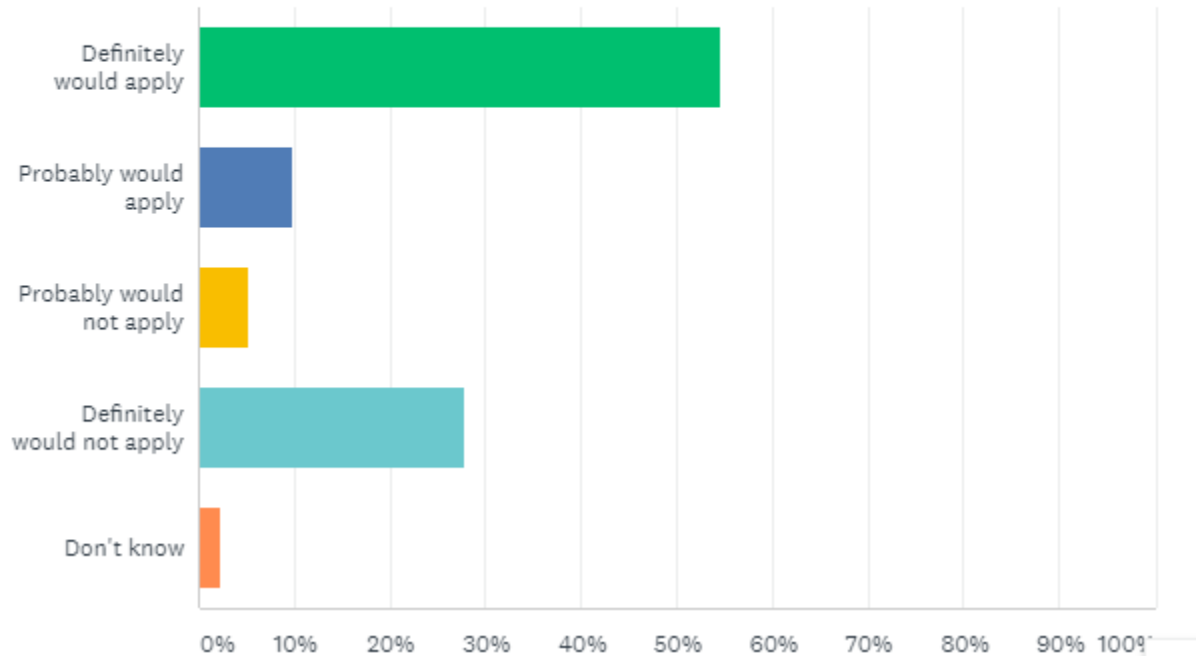
Would you like to have a cycle hangar installed on your road or street?

3.2 Summary of post code analysis and demographics

Responsees were fairly evenly split between men and women. The largest single age range of responsees was 25-34 (35%). 69% of responsees stated that they were in full time work. 73% of responsees identified themselves as White British.

No responses were received from statutory bodies and other stakeholders

5. What happens next

The responses are being analysed and where appropriate locations are being reconsidered. The hangars will be installed in 2 phases between spring and autumn 2020. A further statutory consultation stage will be carried out on the traffic order ahead of this time.

Proposal for cycle hangar on Aquinas Street

Dear Resident,

I am delighted to inform you that we are going to install more cycle hangars in your area. For this phase of hangars we are going to tackle the high numbers of people waiting for spaces in existing hangars across Lambeth.

Our engineer has highlighted a location that would be suitable for a new cycle hangar 29 Aquinas Street. The map overleaf shows where the hangar might be positioned in relation to your address. Lambeth has already installed over 220 secure cycle hangars. However, to meet growing demand for secure cycle parking, we are proposing to double the number of hangars which will provide over 1000 bike hangar spaces by 2022.



This consultation is an opportunity for you to highlight if you are in favour of the scheme and specify if you have any objections to the location that has been identified.

We would like to know what you think about our proposal to install a cycle hangar on your street, this letter marks the beginning of the consultation.
