PROPOSED EXTENSION OF KENNINGTON CONSERVATION AREA (C.A.8) (Princes Ward)

The following reference from the Conservation Areas Advisory Committee (31.7.79) is submitted:-

RECOMMENDATION OF CONSERVATION AREAS ADVISORY COMMITTEE

That Kennington Conservation Area (C.A.8) be extended to include (i) the area known as the Triangle adjacent to Kennington Road, (ii) Methley, Milverton and Ravensdon Streets, and (iii) if suitable, the area surrounding Bowden Street.

For decision

The Conservation Areas Advisory Committee considered a suggestion summitted by the South London Society of Architects that Kennington Conservation Area (C.A.8) should be extended to include the area known as the Triangle adjacent to Kennington Road and Methley, Milverton and Ravensdon Streets. It was felt that both areas were homogeneous, the former built in the early 19 century on open space and incorporating the other side of Windmill Row (which is within the present Conservation Area) and the latter built in 1868 (architect Alfred Lovejoy).

It was further suggested that the area around Bowden Street containing commercial and industrial premises should be investigated to see whether it could also be included.

The Advisory Committee supported the suggestions and referred the matter to Town Planning Committee for decision.
