

South Bank and Waterloo Neighbourhood Plan Referendum

Information Statement

Two referendums, one Residential Referendum and one Business Referendum relating to the adoption of the South Bank and Waterloo Neighbourhood Plan will be held on Thursday 24th October 2019.

The question which will be asked in both Referendums is:

“Do you want the London Boroughs of Lambeth and Southwark to use the Neighbourhood Plan for South Bank and Waterloo to help it decide planning applications in the neighbourhood area?”

The Referendum area is identified on the map included with this information statement.

The Referendum area is identical to the area which has been designated as the South Bank and Waterloo Neighbourhood area.

A person is entitled to vote in the Residential Referendum if on 24th October 2019

- he or she is entitled to vote in a local government election in the Referendum area; and
- his or her qualifying address for the election is in the Referendum area. A persons qualifying address for the election is, in relation to a person registered in the register of electors, the address in respect of which he or she is entitled to be registered.

A business is entitled to vote in the Business Referendum if on 24th October 2019

- the business is a non-domestic ratepayer in the Referendum area; and
- the business has registered a named voter as their business vote holder on the business voting register.

(All eligible businesses will be invited to register a named voter on the business voting register from Wednesday 21st August 2019).

The overall expenses limit that will apply in relation to both Referendums, and the number of persons by reference to which that limit has been calculated, shall be published and made available as soon as practicable after the initial business registration list is received.

The referendum will be conducted in accordance with procedures which are similar to those used at local government elections.
