**REDUCTION OF A PARKING SPACE IN BLAIRDERRY ROAD TO ENABLE  
SAFE ACCESS TO A BIN CHAMBER**

*(NOTE: This Notice is about the removal of a length of parking space and the installation of at any time waiting restrictions (indicated by double yellow lines) at that location instead, so as to allow safe access to and from a bin chamber.)*

1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of the London Borough of Lambeth on 13<sup>th</sup> March 2019 made the Lambeth (Streatham Hill West "G") (Parking Places) (No. 1) Order 2019 and the Lambeth (Waiting and Loading Restrictions) (Amendment No. 281) Order 2019 under sections 6, 45, 46, 49 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984. The Orders will come into force on 18<sup>th</sup> March 2019.
2. The general effect of the Orders will be to reduce a length of a shared use residents'/business/pay and display parking in Blairderry Road which lies on the south-east side, by 3.9 metres and install double yellow lines in that length of road instead.
3. The Orders are required to prevent parking where it will be an obstruction particularly to refuse collection vehicles requiring access to and from the bin chamber at this site.

A copy of each of the Orders and documents giving more detailed particulars about them (including a map) are available for inspection from 9.30 am until 4.30 pm on Mondays to Fridays inclusive (except bank/public holidays) until the last day of a period of six weeks beginning with the date on which the Orders are made, at the offices of Lambeth Council's Highways and Enforcement Group (Environment and Growth), 3<sup>rd</sup> Floor, Civic Centre, 6 Brixton Hill, London SW2 1EG. If any person wishes to question the validity of the Orders or of any of their provisions on the grounds that it or they are not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under that Act has not been complied with, that person may, within 6 weeks from the date on which the Orders are made, apply for the purpose to the High Court.
