PROPOSED INTRODUCTION OF ROAD HUMPS IN PART OF NEW PARK ROAD

[NOTE: This Notice is about proposals to provide new cycle friendly “sinusoidal” road humps in New Park Road, between its junction with Streatham Place and Atkins Road (the South Circular) and its junction with Thornton Road and Thornton Avenue. Objections or other comments may be made – see paragraph 5.]

1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of the London Borough of Lambeth proposes, under section 90A of the Highways Act 1980, to introduce road humps known as “sinusoidal” road humps in **New Park Road**, at the following locations:

- (a) outside No. 97;
- (b) outside New Park Road Baptist Church and the Sports Court;
- (c) outside Camelford Court, just north of the Hayes Court access road;
- (d) outside Nos. 5/10 Fortrose Gardens;
- (e) outside No. 104 and the side of Nos. 11/29 Fortrose Gardens;
- (f) outside No. 114 and No. 193;
- (g) outside Nos. 128 and 130 and No. 219; and
- (h) outside Nos. 138 and 140.

[Each “sinusoidal” road hump would be a round-topped, elevated section of carriageway that is no more than 100 millimetres higher than the existing carriageway, and which extends across the full width of the carriageway from kerb to kerb and has a width of 3 metres.]

2. The road humps are necessary to improve safety by reducing traffic speeds and the potential for road accidents. Sinusoidal road humps are cycle friendly and encourage smoother driving of vehicles with less pollution-inducing acceleration and deceleration.
