ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984 - SECTION 14(2)

**TEMPORARY PEDESTRIAN AND CYCLE ZONES IN LOWER MARSH
AND SUSPENSION OF PART OF THE ONE-WAY TRAFFIC
SYSTEM IN FRAZIER STREET**

1. The Council of the London Borough of Lambeth HEREBY GIVES NOTICE under section 14(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act"), that from 20th July 2020 for 21 days:-

- (a) pedestrian and cycle zones will be in operation between 11 am and 3 pm and between 4.45 pm and 9 pm on Mondays to Fridays inclusive in the following lengths of Lower Marsh:-
 - (i) between the north-eastern wall of No. 140 Lower Marsh and the south-western kerb-lines of Frazier Street and Launcelot Street; and
 - (ii) between the common boundary of Nos. 80/81 and 82 Lower Marsh and the north-eastern kerb-lines of Frazier Street and Launcelot Street; and
- (b) the one-way traffic system in that length of Frazier Street which lies between a point 10 metres south-east of the south-eastern wall of No. 27 Lower Marsh and the north-western kerb-line of Murphy Street, will be suspended to allow access to garages.

2. Alternative routes are available for vehicles affected by the pedestrian and cycle zone via adjacent roads.

3. The pedestrian and cycle zone will not apply to vehicles being used for Police, Ambulance or Fire Brigade purposes or to anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform.

4. It is necessary for the pedestrian and cycle zone (and consequently the suspension of part of the one-way traffic system) to come into force without delay because of a likelihood of danger to the public posed by vehicle traffic to pedestrians in the relatively narrow road during times of high footfall.

5. The pedestrian and cycle zone and the suspension of the one-way traffic system will be in force by virtue of this notice for 21 days. After that time, the Council intends to make a temporary order under section 14(1) of the Act so that the zone and suspension will continue to apply for a maximum duration of 18 months.
