Temporary Traffic and Parking
Restrictions in Connection with the Lambeth
Country Show

1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of the London Borough of Lambeth have made Orders the general effect of which will be, at certain times on Saturday 18th July and Sunday 19th July 2009:-

(a) to impose one-way workings for vehicles:-

- (i) in Brockwell Park Gardens, between Trinity Rise and Norwood Road in a direction towards Norwood Road;
 - (ii) in Gubyon Avenue, in a direction towards Herne Hill;
 - (iii) in Hurst Street, in a direction towards Dulwich Road;
 - (iv) in Milkwood Road, between Herne Hill/Norwood Road and Gubyon Avenue, in a direction towards Gubyon Avenue;
 - (v) in Milton Road, in a direction towards Raiton Road;
 - (vi) in Raiton Road, between Milton Road and Rymer Street, in a direction towards Rymer Street;
 - (vii) in Regent Road, in a direction towards Dulwich Road;
 - (viii) in Trinity Rise, between Norwood Road and Brockwell Park Gardens in a direction towards Brockwell Park Gardens;
- (b) to ban waiting by vehicles in the streets and parts of streets specified in the Schedule to this Notice.

2. The above-mentioned one-way workings and bans will only apply at such times as shall be indicated by the placing of temporary traffic signs and 'no parking cones'. They are necessary because of the likelihood of danger to the public caused by an increase in traffic and parking in the vicinity of Brockwell Park, while the Lambeth Country Show is taking place.

3. Alternative routes are available for vehicles affected by the one-way workings and bans referred to in paragraph 1 above, via adjacent roads.

BROCKWELL PARK GARDENS, between Effra Road/Tulse Hill and Dulwich Road, except in the parking places.
BROCKWELL PARK GARDENS, its whole length.
CROXTED ROAD, between Norwood Road and the common boundary of Nos. 284 and 286 Croxted Road.
DALBORG ROAD, between Morval Road and Dulwich Road, except in the parking places.
DULWICH ROAD, between Norwood Road and No. 35 Dulwich Road.
HERNE HILL, the west side, between Norwood Road and a point 5 metres north of Carver Road.
MILKWOOD ROAD, the north-east side, between Herne Hill and Gubyon Avenue.
NORWOOD ROAD, (a) the west side, between

Herne Hill and Trinity Rise, except in the designated loading bay on Saturday 21st July 2007 between the hours of 7am and 7pm and (b) the east side, between the southern kerb-line

Temporary Road Closures

Arlington Road, Brailsford Road, Dalerg Road and Milton Road

1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that, to enable Thames Water to carry out flood alleviation works, Lambeth Borough Council intend to make an Order the effect of which will be to temporarily ban vehicles from entering:-

- (a) Arlington Road,
 - (i) between Brixton Water Lane and the northern arm of Brailsford Road;
 - (ii) between the northern arm of Brailsford Road and the southern arm of Brailsford Road; and
 - (iii) between the southern arm of Brailsford Road and south-eastern extremity.

(an alternative route for vehicles would be available Brixton Water Lane, Effra Road, St Matthews Road, Brixton Hill, Effra Road Tulse Hill and Brailsford Road);

- (b) Brailsford Road,
 - (i) between the northern arm and the southern arm; and
 - (ii) between the southern arm and its south-eastern extremity.

(alternative routes for vehicles would be available via (i) Arlington Road and the northern arm of Brailsford Road; and (ii) Arlington Road and the southern arm of Brailsford Road);

- (c) that length of Dalerg Road which lies between the southern kerb-line of Mervan Road and a point 142 metres south-east of Mervan Road (alternative routes for vehicles would be available via (i) Mervan Road, Rattray Road and Jelf Road and vice versa; and (ii) Mervan Road, Effra Road and Morval Road);

- (d) that length of Milton Road which lies between the north-eastern kerb-line of Dulwich Road and the party wall of No 46 & 48 Milton Road (alternative routes would be available via (i) Dulwich Road, Shakespeare Road, Raiton Road and vice versa; and (ii) Dulwich Road, Regent Road, Raiton Road and vice versa).

2. The Order would only apply at such times and to such extent as shall be indicated by the placing of the appropriate traffic signs and will not apply to any vehicle connected with the works.

3. The Order would come into force on 20th July 2009 and would continue for a maximum duration of 10 months, or until the works have been completed whichever is the sooner.

Planning (Listed Buildings & Conservation Areas) Act 1990 (as amended)

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of the London Borough of Lambeth, in pursuance of powers under section 70 of the planning (Listed Buildings & Conservation Areas) Act 1990 (as amended) made the following designation of a new conservation Area within the London Borough of Lambeth on 8th June, 2009.

- (i) The new Streamham Lodge Estate Conservation Area (C.A. No.62) includes the following addresses:-

The objective of designation is to preserve or enhance the character or appearance of areas of special architectural or historic interest, as distinct from individual buildings, to control developments in such areas and to stimulate and encourage measures to improve the environment. The primary effects of conservation area status are that the demolition of certain buildings is brought within conservation area control and consent must first be sought from the planning authority, that it becomes an offence to cut down, lop or carry out any other works to certain trees within the area without proper consent from the planning authority; and that planning applications for development which in the opinion of the planning authority, would effect the character or appearance of the conservation area, must be advertised.
